Clackamas rolls as Hordemann's 39 points lead team in overtime

After having a shaky season during the month of January, the men's basketball team is on fire -- winning their past three games.

The Cougars went into last Wednesday's game against Portland Community College with what seemed to be no identity and an inconsistent defense. Facing one of the hottest teams in the league in the Panthers, Clackamas rolled to a 97-82 victory as six players scored in double figures. Freshman Antwain Williams led the Cougars with 21 points and 15 rebounds while Clint Hordemann added 20 points and 13 rebounds.

"That was the best I have seen a Clackamas team play in two years," said Assistant Coach Trev Kiser. "Everybody played extremely well; everyone passed well, our offense was running great. Everybody was happy."

The team shot 46 percent from the field [35-76] and 50 percent from beyond the three-point line.

"They played so well together," added Kiser. "They made the extra pass, they played tough defense. They were a team."

Adding to the offensive showing were Oscar Rodriguez [17 points], Gabe McCune [12], Brian Hay [12] and Jared Bullock [11].

"Everybody got a piece of the action," said Kiser.

This past Saturday the Cougars traveled to Albany to face the Linn-Benton Roadrunners in one of the most thrilling games of the season.

Clackamas opened up the game hot-handed to take a 7-2 lead in the first half but quickly saw that lead turn into a 21-8 deficit within minutes. The men battled throughout the first 20 minutes of the game, but a sputtering offense [20 percent shooting in the first half] only allowed the Cougars to finish the half with 16 points. The game was far from over, however, as Clint Hordemann led an inspired Clackamas team in the second half.

Hordemann scored the tying basket with 1.6 seconds remaining.

"We were down by three with

nine seconds left in regulation," said Kiser. "Clint went coast to coast and dunked it to bring us within one. We fouled real quick, they got one free throw, and Clint came down again and laid it in to send it into overtime."

"We scored 16 points in the first half," said Kiser. "I have never seen a college team only score 16 points in a half. But we came back and scored 61 in the second."

Hordemann, along with Antwain Williams, led the team into the extra period where the Cougars outscored the Roadrunners 17-9 to claim a remarkable 77-69

victory. Hordemann finished the game with 39 points, 13 rebounds, six steals, four assists and four blocked shots. Williams finished with 15 points and seven rebounds.

"We're on a three game winning streak," said Kiser. "That's the longest of the season. The guys are all pumped, we're playing well. We're a game out of first place - from winning the league title with the rest of our games at home."

The Cougars' next home action is tonight in the Randall Gym at 8 p.m.



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
