Felando was named to All-League First Team while Walsworth was given second team honors.

Southern Division champions reload for NWAACC tournament

Clackamas is the best volleyball team in the northwest.

The Cougars have been in first place all year. The team has been ranked number one in each of this year's Horizon Air Coaches' Polls. Its last loss was on October 11, 1995. That's right, 1995.

Last Wednesday, Head Coach Kathie Woods' team traveled to Salem to play second-ranked Chemeketa in its final regular season game of the year.

Clackamas lost 7-15, 8-15, 14-16.

The Cougars finished the regular season with an 11-1 league record, 38-9 overall.

Now, it's time for the big show.

On Friday, November 7, Clackamas clinched the Southern Division title with a commanding win over fourth-ranked Mt. Hood in the Saints' gym 15-11, 15-10, 7-15, 15-13.

The victory marked the 28th consecutive league win for the Cougars, a mark which now stands as a Northwest Athletic Association of Community Colleges [NWAACC] record.

Four players recorded kill numbers in double figures with Christy Ekberg making 18 kills, Amy Kraljev with 15, Michelle McKinney with 13 and Mattye Walsworth adding 10 kills.

Walsworth, one of three sophomore team captains, continued her defensive prowess recording 39 digs as well. Amy Felando, another of this year's tri-captains, had 54 assists.

With the win over Mt. Hood, Clackamas earned the top seed from the south giving them a first round bye in this week's NWAACC Championship Tournament in Bellevue, WA.

"It was disappointing losing to Chemeketa," said Coach Woods. "But we need to look at the total picture. We are the Southern Division champs. The total picture

says that we lost a league game to #2 ranked Chemeketa. Out of 27 teams, if we had to lose a league game it would be to Chemeketa. It's not that we lost that is disappointing. It's the fact that we didn't play well in doing so. This isn't going to devastate or destroy us. We have our sights set on NWAACCs."

With the first round bye, the Cougars' first game isn't until 9 a.m. on Friday while most other teams must play at least one game tomorrow.

"We'll either play Everett, Shoreline or Clark College," said Woods. "Now, we're not going to overlook anybody but those teams don't come from a particularly strong region so we're sitting pretty good right now."

"I know the sophomores will step up as real leaders in the tournament," added Woods. "They've been here before and they've won it before but the freshmen have to show me that they'll support them. I expect them all to pick it up a notch. As the season gets long, people get tired and frustrated with each other. Lately we've been lacking dedication and discipline so we just need to refocus. The team just needs to come together."

Last week, Amy Felando and Amy Kraljev were given First-Team All-League honors while Mattye Walsworth was named to the second team. Christy Ekberg and Michelle McKinney were given Honorable Mention.

Walsworth and Felando will participate in this year's sophomore all-star game held in Walla Walla, Dec. 5-6.

After the Cougars' early morning game, they play next at 5:30 against an opponent to be determined. Coach Woods, however, isn't planning on returning home until after Saturday's 7 p.m. championship match. And a little celebrating, of course.

"We've had a setback," said Woods, "but all championship teams rebound from those setbacks."
