Alfredo Villarreal scored 10 points off the bench and added a team-high four assists.

Pilgreen and Rodriguez scored nine points apiece in their final game with the Cougars.

Freshman post Scott Riddle grabbed a team-high seven rebounds and scored seven points.

Despite finishing with a 5-9 record in the Southern Division and 14-15 overall, Coach Kiser was pleased with his team's improvement throughout the season.

"We played really well the second half of the season," said Kiser. "I felt we outplayed every team except Lane. They were just too much for us."

The Cougars have 11 freshmen eligible to return for next year's squad, a team that should be dominated by sophomores. Among the possible returners are Coleman, Villarreal, point guard Cody Eckman, Bright, Lake, wing Roland Contreras, post David Cohen, Riddle and post Billy Townsend.

Cohen was expected to be one of the Cougars' top players, but was out with an injury for much of the season. Cohen was averaging 18 points and 10 rebounds before the injury.

"Cohen could have really helped us this year," said Kiser. "He's a good player and a force inside."

Redshirts Rick Chaney, guard, and Michael Holmes, post, both are eligible to come back next year as freshmen.

The Titans were led by freshman

post Dan Carter, who recorded game-highs with 30 points and 18 rebounds. Carter was 15-23 from the floor and pulled down seven offensive rebounds.

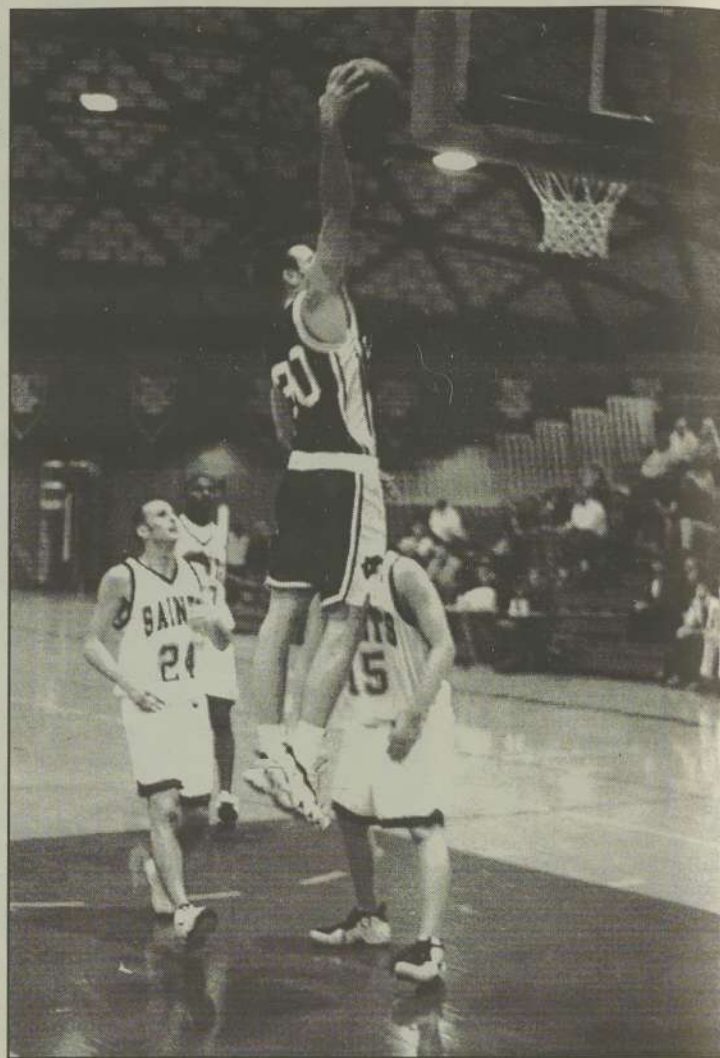
Freshman guard Andrew Brogden scored 20 points and sophomore forward Chris Clark added 15 points. The two of them combined to make 7-14 from beyond the arc.

Sophomores Kevin McMann and Ryan Hales reached double figures with 14 and 12 points, respectively and combined to hit 11-16 shots from the floor.

The victory clinched the top spot in the Southern Division for the Titans and guarantees them a berth in the NWAACC tournament.

Lane [12-2, 23-6] hosts Linn-Benton Community College [8-6, 15-11] Thursday in the first round of the playoffs. The winners of the two Southern Division playoff games will face off Saturday.

The NWAACC tournament begins Thursday, March 5 at Big Bend Community College.
