Clackamas continues success, qualifies 29 for championships

For some athletes, their best isn't good enough.

For the members of this year's track and field team, their best seems to be changing every week.

The Cougars set out in two directions this past weekend and returned with the same result — a much improved team.

Most of the squad traveled to Tacoma, Wa. to participate in the 16th annual J.D. Shotwell Invitational on Saturday while some competed in Salem, Ore.

Ricardo Colon won the 100m to move up to #4 on the school's all-time list with a time of 10.65. Colon also won the long jump event with a mark of 22' 5.75" and finished second in the 200 [21.92] in his best time of the season.

"Ricardo had a great meet," said Clackamas Head Coach Jack Kegg. "He is one of our best athletes."

Chris Chatfield recorded a season's best time in the 800m [1:59.66] and a personal best in the 5000m [15:47.12].

Dante Betha returned from nursing a lagging injury and placed 4th in the 400m [50.09].

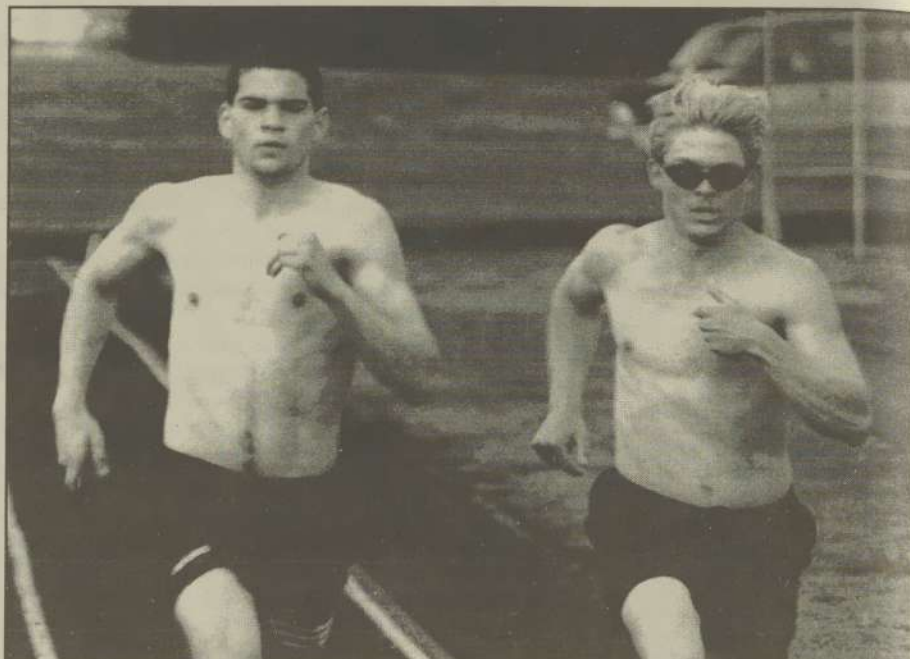
"Dante did very well," noted Kegg. "We've been holing him out the last few meets because he was injured. He's coming back very strong though."

Robin Peters also competed in the 400m dash, recording a personal best time of 51.26.

On the women's team, Jennifer Rea finished in a season's best times in the 5K [18:37.44] to finish fourth and in the 3K [10:50.77].

Sarah Decker also recorded her best time of the spring in the 3K with a time of 11:22.76.

The women javelin throwers placed well in the meet. Tristan Sharp finished second while Jennifer Gardner finished fourth.

"The ladies placed well," noted Kegg, "but they didn't throw their best marks."

In Salem, Peter Schmidlin won the shot put event while recording a personal best mark of 46'10".

Otto Schneider placed third in the long jump with a season's best mark of 21'1/2" and fourth in the javelin with a mark of 144'2".

Clackamas has qualified 17 men and 12 women for the NWAACC Championships so far this spring.

"We've had a lot of athletes qualify," noted Kegg. "It's pretty unusual for a team to have this many athletes qualified this early in the season."

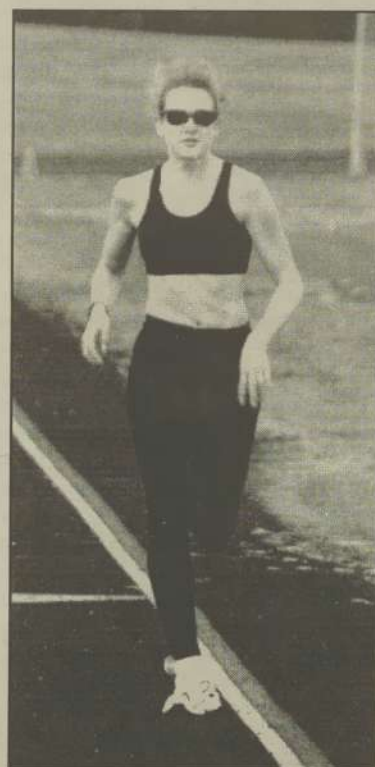
"We look to be back at top form," added Kegg. "We've got some runners coming back from injury and some others really starting to improve. We're beginning to peak at the right time."

Clackamas next competes in the Western Open in Monmouth this Saturday.
