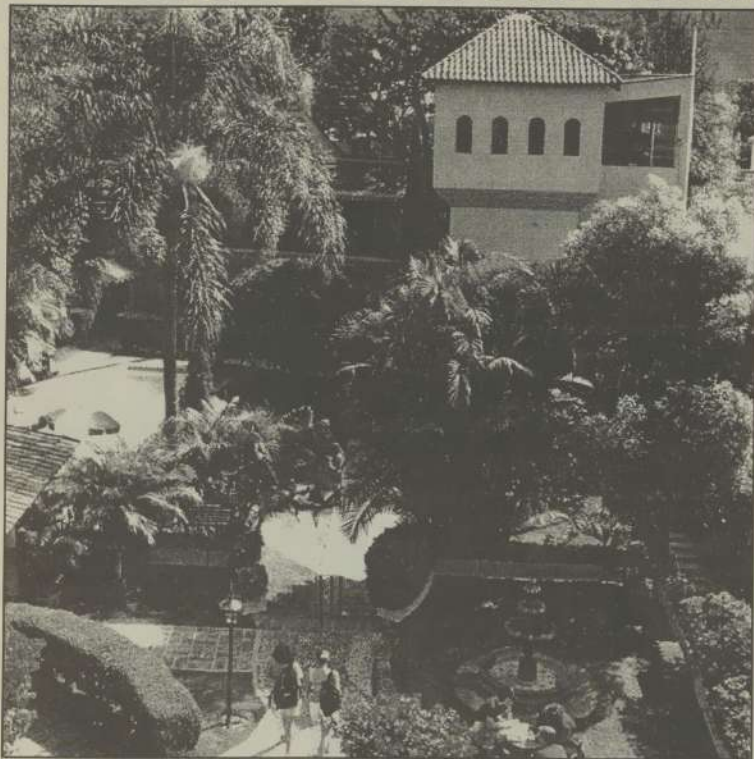


Clackamas offers education under the sun in Mexico

Now even Oregonians can see the increasing need for a greater understanding of other cultures. A great way to increase this understanding is through learning another language and more importantly, immersing oneself in the culture. That is why Clackamas has continued this year with the summer study program in Cuernavaca, Mexico.

"This is a time to explore our commonalities and differences with people from another culture," said Ellen Wolfson, international advisor at Clackamas.

Wolfson has organized the program annually and is knowledgeable about the area and culture of Cuernavaca, a region located about one and half hours south of Mexico City. Students can expect warmth in both the climate and the people of this area.

"The people here are warm-hearted and gracious," said Wolfson.

Students will have a lot of contact with the people by living with Mexican families for four weeks. During these weeks they will study six hours

of Spanish language and cultural classes every day. The learning experience will be of top quality with no more than five students per classroom and native instructors. Credits can even be earned in the education program.

When students are not studying they will have opportunities to visit nearby pyramids and indigenous markets that are common in the area. A small bus trip can take you to beaches such as Acapulco or villages high in the mountains. Not far to the north, the colossal Mexico City can be explored along with its multitudes of parks and museums.

"The greatest part of the experience is taking a local bus with the families and visiting the places you wouldn't go to as a tourist," said Wolfson.

There is still space for more people to sign up for the program right now. The summer classes run from July 17 to Aug. 14. The cost is \$1940, including airfare, classes, and homestay with Mexican family.
