**Teacher Training Workshop**

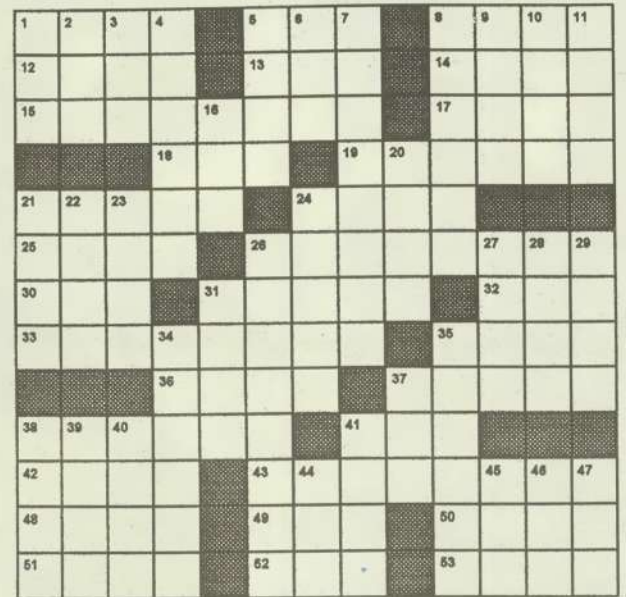
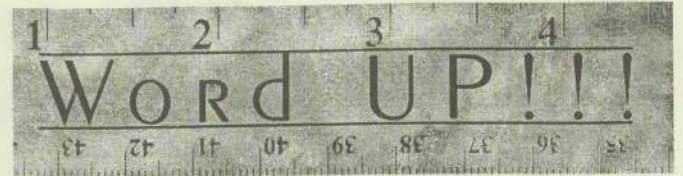
