Free math tutoring is being offered in the Math Lab on a drop-in basis. Don't get stuck—stop by today!

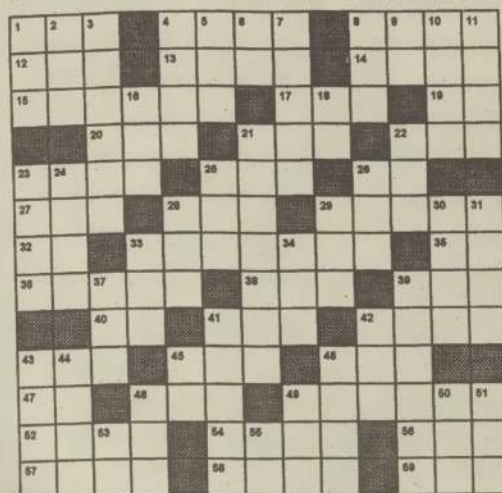
Earn Credit while Volunteering
