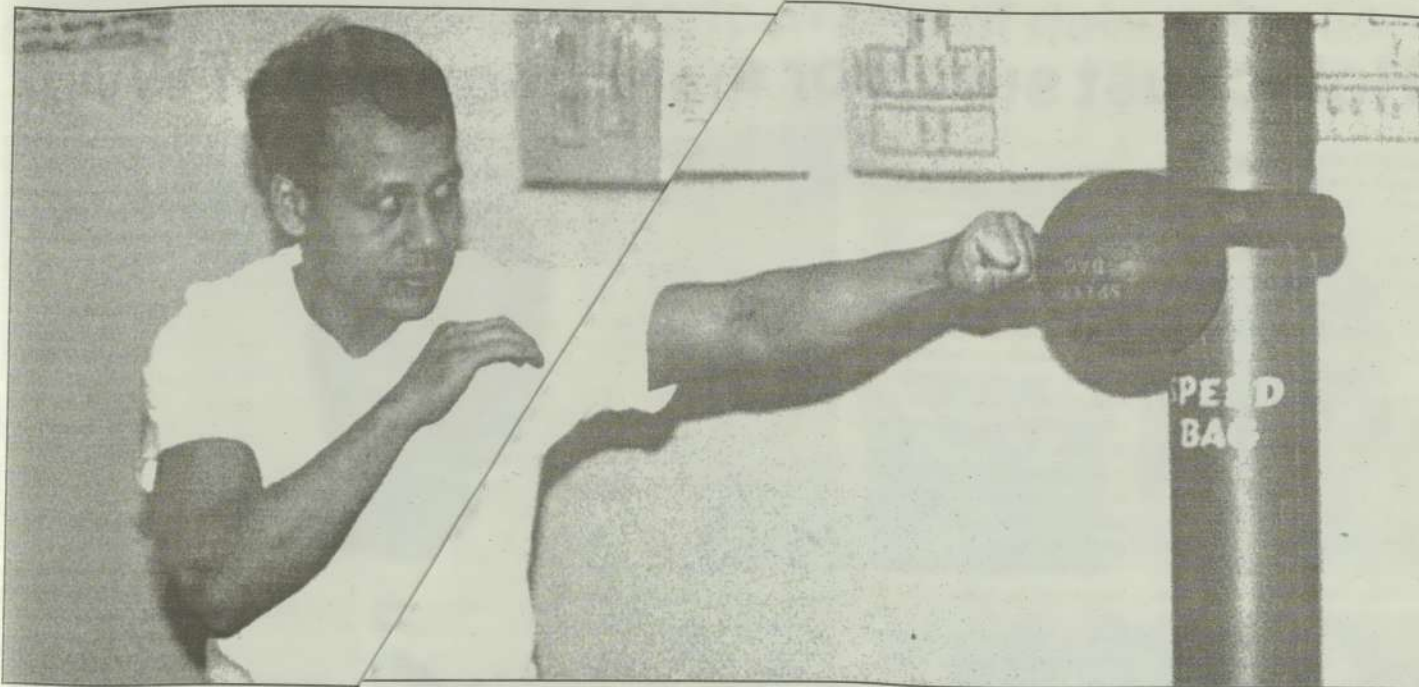




Shuny Bee, martial arts instructor, hones his skills by practicing on a speed bag. Bee has developed his own style called Shun Ken Do.

Shuny Bee, founder of the Shun Ken Do style of martial arts, would like to share his knowledge with Clackamas students.

Shuny Bee has been seeking support from the Athletic Department, ASG, and students to develop a Karate Club. According to Robin Robinson, Karate instructor, Clackamas had a Karate Club a couple years ago but it died out, due to liability issues.

Jim Jackson of the Athletic Dept. stated that the department had allocated space for the club in the dance room in the basement of Randall Hall, after school hours.

Bee hopes to have a better turnout this time to keep Karate Club going strong for a very long time. "I would like to share my knowledge of martial arts, also of my own style, Shun Ken Do," he said.

Shuny Bee began martial arts study 22 years ago. He first started learning from the little bit that his brother had taught him. Bee says the most memorable instructor was his last, Jay Ke Shin, the Father of Napal for Tae Kwan Do.

Bee has been an Instructor at United States Championship Tae Kwan Do for one year. He is a four Dan (fourth degree) black belt, and also a Nunchaku (Art of Fancy) expert.

Bee has also been acting for

some time and has appeared in two movies, called "Blazing Force" and "Wounded by Fear." He will be starting "Region of the Johnny Lake" in a month or so, and filming will be in Vancouver, B.C. Bee hopes to recruit students from his classes and the Karate Club as movie extras.

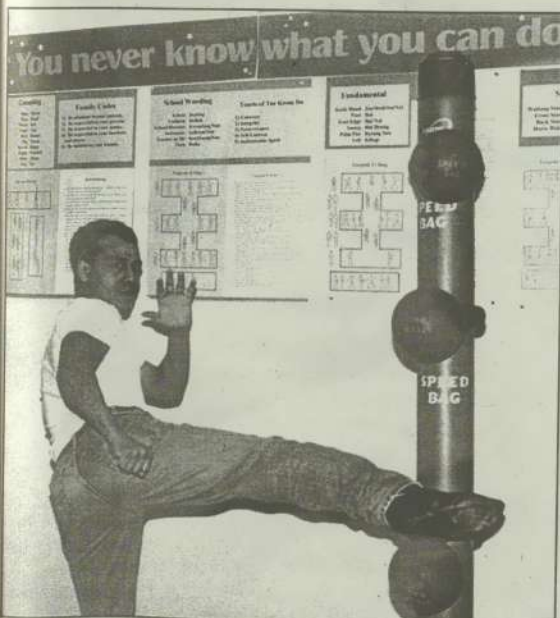
According to Michelle Waggoner, ASG Student Activities directors secretary, the Karate Club has been approved and they are now setting up the accounts for it.
