Even then, it would only service one or two phones, and the college already pays for cellular phone service.

According to Milton Reuck in the Information Technology Services department, connections to the campus were restored gradually over the

weekend and into Monday morning. Internet service was not restored until 1pm Monday.

Audix voice mail, which operates all of the incoming voice lines and the voice mail, was restored with the first phone lines on Saturday. Because of continuing repairs, according to Reuck, the voice mail system crashed again on Monday at 11:39am. This also prevented people from calling into the campus.

ASG's Fuentes notes bad student behavior



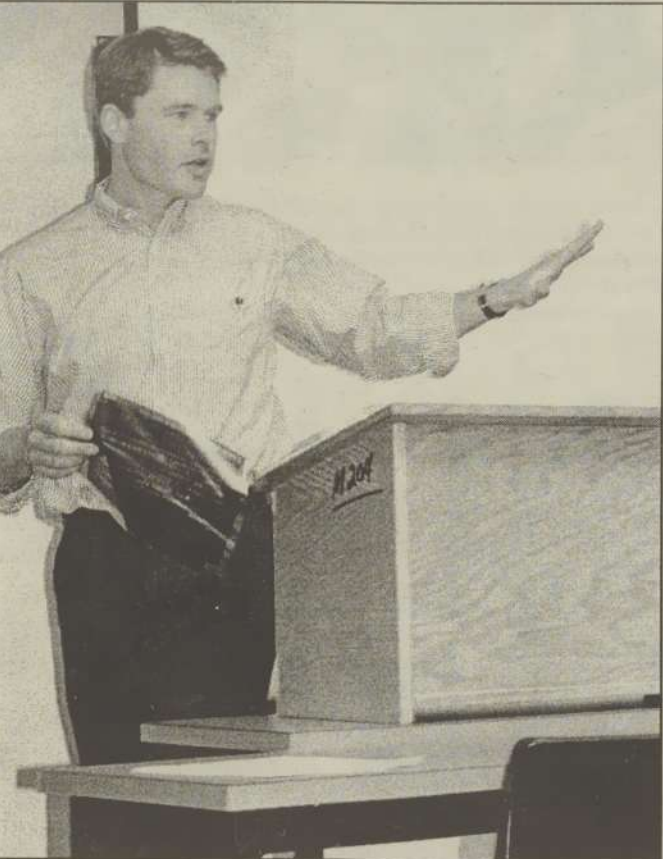
