ASG election results official, Rankin wins

Jennifer Rankin won out over Lynn Brown and Mike Lewis to become next year's ASG President, but some of the voting procedures have been questioned by one of the losing candidates.

James Gould beat Jacob Pence in the vice-presidential race by 98 votes.

Presidential candidate Lynn Brown expressed concerns that some of students who are in the evening classes did not have enough time to vote.

"I know for a fact some students from the evening classes came over to vote and found the polls closed. I found out too late to contest the vote," she said.

Elections Chairman Bryan Fuentez announced before the elec-

tions that polling would be available for evening students until 8 p.m. on each of the two days the polls were open.

"We were supposed to go to eight, we advertised to eight, but we had nobody show up for an hour and a half on Monday," Fuentez said.

The polls closed early that Monday evening and on Tuesday the votes were validated and counted in CC126 well before the 8 p.m. deadline.

Fuentez explained that if anyone felt the election should be contested, according to the election bylaws a complaint should be turned in before the ballots are counted.

It was too late when a student from an evening class entered the room where the ballots were being validated to discover that the polls

were closed and she had lost the opportunity to vote.

Tuesday evening after the polls were closed and before the counting had begun, no one contested the election. After the ballots were counted, the candidates present were asked if they wanted to contest the results and Lynn Brown said she would not.

When asked later if she found the election results satisfactory or would still try to contest the vote, she said, "satisfied, no; contesting, no."

In an interview after the balloting was made official, Gould commented on the early closing of the polls.

"If you're going to say something is going to be open it should be open, regardless if it is one person coming in or many," Gould said.
