

Bond to expand, construct campus buildings

A \$47 million bond will be presented to voters next May in hopes of restoring and expanding Clackamas Community College.

The bond reflects the school's "Facility Master Plan" which has been the focus of two years of institutional strategic planning.

All areas of the college have been invited to participate, and campus-wide forums have been held to update staff and solicit feedback. The plan focuses on Clackamas' needs during the next five years.

With the passage of the bond, the school's 34-year-old campus

will be expanded. New additions will include a new classroom building to house the departments of English, journalism, art, music, theater, dance and speech; additions and renovations to Barlow Hall; a second floor to the Community Center; an addition to Pauling Hall; a second floor to the north wing of the Family Resource Center; a new building expanding the apprenticeship training center; a new horticulture greenhouse; a new building connecting Dye

& Streeter and adding labs, classrooms, and offices.

Long term development, when possible, will add two more buildings, a parking garage and additions

to many of the existing buildings.

A model has been built demonstrating the short-term development.

"We wanted to make a model to get a feel for how the campus is growing," said Dian Connett, Dean of Instructional Services. Connett was the liaison between the school and the architects who made the model.

Last spring drafting student Joey Jones was selected to work with Yost, Grube and Hall, architectural firm in Downtown Portland, to help build the model. He received cooperative work experience credit.

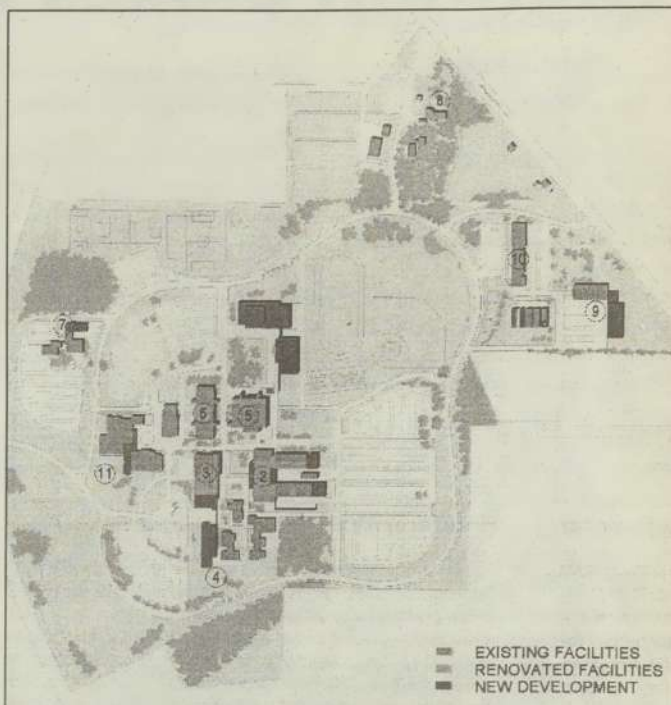
"I had to take the scale off the prints and transfer them to the model," said Jones.

Jones cut out pieces of basswood with small hand-held blades to form the model. The project took two months to complete.

The model has since sent back to the architects for some last minute changes and will be on display soon in the Community Center.

Avalanche awareness seminar open to public, stresses safety

The snow season is approaching and with it comes the danger of avalanches.

Tim O'Brien of O'Brien AdventureSport is offering Avalanche Awareness seminars to the general public and snow-sport professionals.

The seminar is one-day of attendee's choice. The class offers avalanche awareness to

recreational backcountry travelers including skiers, snowboarders, snowshoers, climbers, and snowmobilers.

The seminars will be held at Sandy Best Western at 37465 Hwy. 26 in Sandy. It will be held 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Dec. 4 and 18; Jan. 8 and 29; Feb. 12, 19 and 26; and March 4. Tuition is \$65 per person and a catered lunch is included. O'Brien expects enrollment of about 15-20 people.

"What I'm trying to provide is

focus with real basic awareness of hazard they may encounter," said O'Brien.

The course will include instruction on avalanche hazard, identification and snow stability evaluation. Rescue strategy instruction will include using radio avalanche transceivers. People who attend the course will be able to estimate avalanche hazards at low, moderate, high and extreme levels.

O'Brien suggests some points to help back country travelers:

- Listen with your ears.
- Be aware of your surroundings.
- Watch for what's around you.
- Listen for a crackling or whoompfing sound from the snow.
- Use common sense.

O'Brien will be the instructor for the classes. He is a professional ski patroller and owner of AdventureSport.
