

# Styrofoam banned in the U.S. for the year 2000

The order allows state colleges to enlist Oregon National Guard soldiers living in their district for the removal duty on campus and allows the biology and environmental students to volunteer, wearing special, protective clothing.

College-age students have used these materials for up to 20 years, and are the legislature's first priority, with campuses across the state ordered to clear out the non-biodegradable goods over the holidays and to notify every enrolled student not to come back Jan. 3 without a doctor's certificate of good health.

Next to college students, the elderly and ill are at greatest risk from the chemical

*dichlorodiphenyltrichloroethane* (DDT), a fatal nerve poison banned in the US by President Nixon in 1973. This is the first recorded finding of DDT since the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) classified the chemical “eradicated” in America in 1983, after 50 years of its use in this country as a pesticide and cure for such diseases as yellow fever and malaria.

Last week the toxin was discovered in plastic wrap (originally called “Saran Wrap” by its inventor Sarah Warp) which is used to wrap food being saved; and the floppy and firm styrofoam cups used for drinking everything, and found at

every campus water fountain.

James Gould, newly confirmed president of the school Associated Student Government (ASG), reminded students calling him over the weekend that Oregon college students are the healthiest and most fit population in the country, raised with clean air and water and reverence for nature and exercise.

“We will calmly gather the facts and take appropriate steps to eliminate any danger,” he said. “Be cool.”

Gould, who replaced the ousted elected ASG president Jennifer Rankin, is moving to Wyoming over the holiday break and plans to complete his Bachelor of Science degree at the University of Wyoming at Laramie within three years.

“I’ll miss my ASG team and the campus,” he said.

The Salem legislators ordered the state printing office to stay open 24 hours a day until every Oregon school, beginning with the colleges, has received the emergency order

and compliance is underway.

The federal congress passed nearly identical emergency legislation in Washington Monday and ordered the Department of Education and the Hazardous Waste Agency to begin work immediately.

President Clinton thanked the congress for their immediate action and told the country the US environmental emergency response system is the most admired in the world and has this crisis well under control.

Dan Lundy, advisor to Clackamas' environmental quality department, reassured, “We are now so advanced in science that our detection of toxins is much sooner, and anti-toxins far more effective and available. In the next few months we’ll probably have one in injection form, like penicillin, and it won’t only cure, it will prevent.

“We are making progress cleaning up our planet now that we have the force of government with us—just like discrimination legislation brought about true equal rights in America, finally, by the year 2001.”
