# 'Everybody's a suspect!'

When I first heard about the upcoming release of *Scream 3*—the final chapter to the Woodsboro murders—excitement started to build. After seeing a private screening of the film with close friends last Thursday evening, one of the most famous lines from the first movie reiterated in my mind:

*"It's a scream baby!"*

Wes Craven has done the impossible—completed a fantastic series with a thrilling ending that left an audience in utter amazement.

'Randy,' played by Jamie Kennedy in the first two films, returns for a final performance in which we learn to forget any truths we may have known about the past.

*"Everybody's a suspect!"*

David Arquette also returns with his quirky character Dewey and accompanies his real-life wife Courtney

Cox-Arquette playing the infamous Gail Weathers in the final act. Cox-Arquette looks so disturbing and disgusting in this film that she could induce random vomiting in the theater seats.

And finally, the heroine herself, Neve Campbell as Sidney Prescott forever immortalizes herself as the *Scream Queen* of all-time.

*"I always had a thing for you Sid!"*

This film is devilishly clever and while many argue that it is not as strong as the original, it provides a powerful ending to the famed story.

The only drawback in this movie is that you would have had to see at least *Scream 1* to understand the finale of events.
