## Three Cougars move on to nationals

Three Clackamas Wrestlers placed at the regional tournament last weekend at Coos Bay and will now step up to compete at the National level.

Shawn Keinonen (157), James Adams (184), and Jason Pence (174) will now move on to Rochester Minnesota to the National Wrestling Tournament on Feb. 19-20 at Mayo Civic Center Auditorium.

The team as a whole had a tough time at the tournament from the beginning. The teams that are not placed in the first or second seats in their weight class, draw in the beginning of the tournament to see who they will wrestle. The team suffered

from the luck of the draw, when the luck did not lean in their favor.

"We were there but we could not get the draws from the beginning, so we knew that it was going to be a very tough day," explained Head Coach Lloyd Martindale. "We had some pretty rough draws."

Two of out of the three champion wrestlers that will move on to the Nationals are freshman. According to Martindale Shawn Keinonen and Jason Pence preformed very well and

it is exciting for him to have them back on the team next year.

"Jason Pence at 174 was really uncontested, he won in the

final round 4-1 and in the semifinals he won 4-1, he really didn't have anyone that challenged him too much,"

said Martindale. "Shawn Keinonen,

right off the bat drew the guy who was seated second in his weight class. He had never beaten the guy before and we knew that it was going to be a tough one,

he did a great job and won 10-5. In the second match he drew the first seat, who was never beaten before and he beat him 6-4 in overtime."

Although the team was challenged from the beginning of the tournament, they wrestled very well. According to coach Martindale he expected a higher turnout for the National tournament, although he is proud of the entire year and all that the wrestlers contributed.

"It's kind of disappointing to only get three guys through, I had no doubt that we would get six guys through," said Martindale. I thought we had a great year, we got some young guys and I thought they did a great job. We went out and we were definately the second or third toughest team."
