## Clackamas athletes dominate home meet

The Clackamas track teams competed in the Clackamas Open on Saturday on their home track. Among the contestants were three other Northwestern Athletic Association of Community Colleges (NWAACC) schools: Southwestern Oregon Community College (SWOCC), Linn-Benton and Lane. The meet was open, so there were other club athletes who competed at the meet.

"We had a good meet overall," explained Head Coach Jack Kegg. "In the men's 100, we had four of the top five finishers although nobody ran particularly well because of the head wind. We still dominated the teams that were here. Same in the men's 1500. We had the top six placers—five were Clackamas athletes and the other kid went to Clackamas last year."

In women's events, Rachel Austin placed first in the long jump with 16'8", qualifying for the NWAACC championships. She also placed third in the high jump with 4'6", ninth (with personal best) in Javelin (92'4), ninth and a personal best in shot put (30'8 1/2) and first with a personal best that qualified Austin for the NWAACC championships, putting her on the top ten list for Clackamas in the 400. Lorna Defreest placed second with a personal best 148'7 1/2" in the hammer, second in shot (39'7 3/4"); Krystal Schneider placed fourth with a personal best 129'4" in the hammer, first in the shot (40'3 1/2"), and first in the discus (127.3 1/2); Amanda Lee placed fourth in shot with 37'8 1/4" and fifth in discus (108.8); Trina Rogers placed first in the Javelin (141'1"); Jazzmin Reece placed third in the 200 (28.27); Cassie Moorhouse placed third in the 800 (2:37.95); Tyana Moralez placed third in the 1500 (5:08.89); Kendal White placed first in the 3k and qualified for the NWAACC championships (10:48.02); Sarah Block placed third in the 3k with a personal best (11:26.92); and Jennie Hardie placed fifth in the 3k (11:44.97).

In the men's event, Jared Tippets placed first in Javelin (181'3"); David Lemen placed

first in the pole vault (16'1"), fifth in the discus (122.4), second in the 100 (11.63) and third with a personal best in shot (41'5 1/4); Shawn Timble placed second in pole vault (15'); Matt Murtzvez placed fourth in pole vault (13'6"); Mike Wheeler placed first in the 100 (11.40); Jo'Shawn Douglas placed fourth in the 100 (11.85); Erik Anderson placed fifth in the 100 with a personal best (11.87) and placed first in the 400 hurdles (53.77); Ryan Hoyt placed first in the 400 (49.44); Ryan Coleman placed first in the 800 (1:58.76); Paul Kezes placed first in the 1500 with a personal best and placed himself at number eight on the Clackamas list; Trevor Dodge placed second in the 1500 with a personal best (4:01.14); Hector Osuna placed fourth in the 1500 with a personal best (4:05.10); Andy Monhead placed fifth in the 1500 (4:06.35) and Ryan Mastropeitro placed sixth in the 1500 (4:08.35). The Clackamas A men's relay team placed first in the 1600m relay.

The Clackamas team will divide to compete in three different meets next week.

Rachel Austin and David Lemen will travel to Spokane to compete in the Multi-Event Championships for NWAACC next Monday and Tuesday. Austin and Lemen are placed as the top competitors.

"They have the best qualifying scores going in. Rachel had an outstanding 400 last weekend and it was the first time she has run that this year. She took one of the fastest times in the conference. She has taken her long jump to a season's best of 16.8, which is an NWAACC qualifier; she has also had a season's best in the shotput and javelin, so she is looking really good," said Kegg. "They are both looking really good. Two years ago, David was the NWAACC champion in the decathlon and he is hoping to win that title back."

In addition to the meet in Spokane, some of the elite team members will compete at Eugene's Oregon Invitational at the University of Oregon; and other members will compete at the Western Oregon Invitational, at Monmouth.
