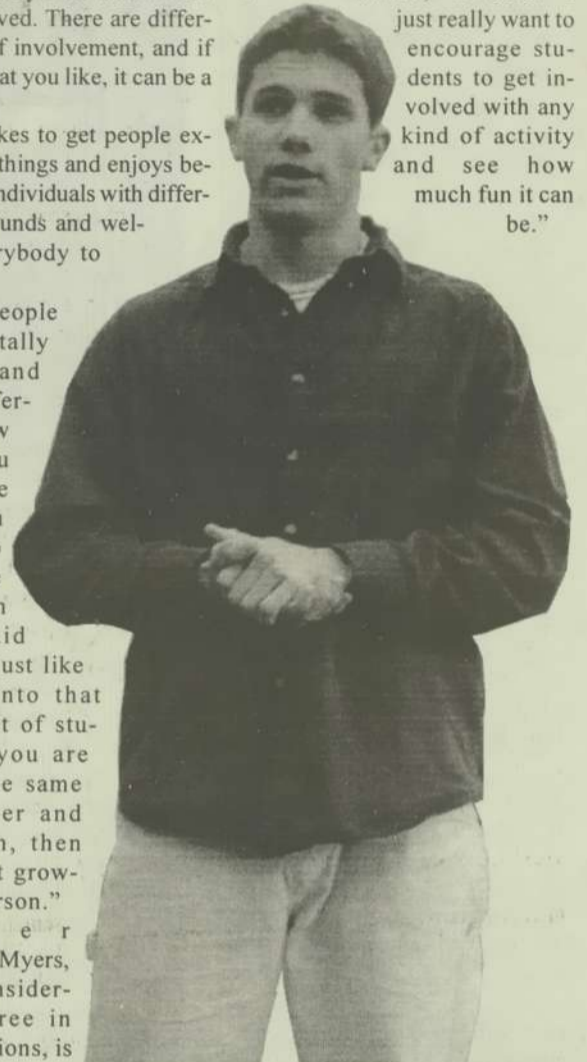
Myers likes to get people excited about things and enjoys being around individuals with different backgrounds and welcomes everybody to join ASG.
