Opening your eyes to art



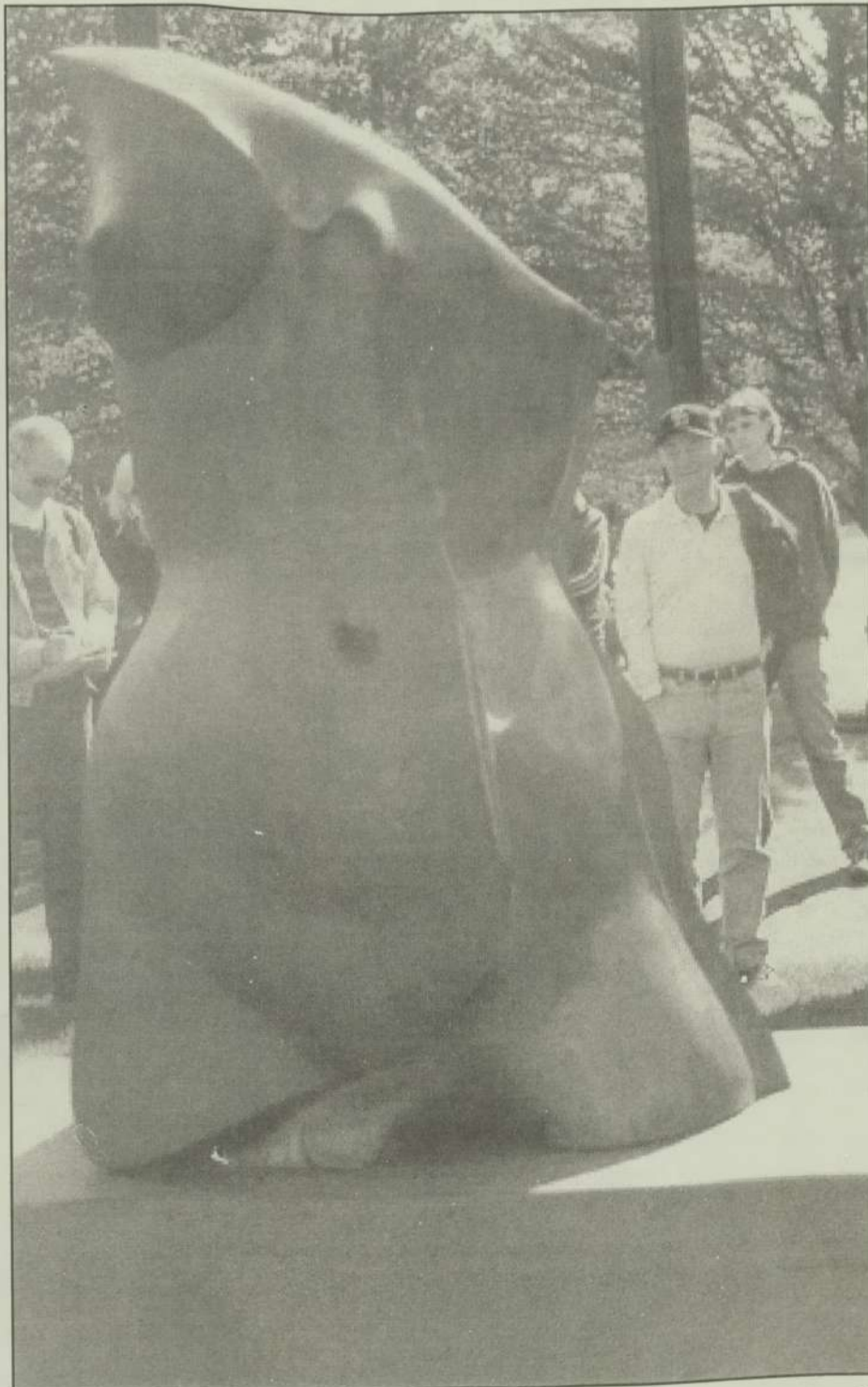

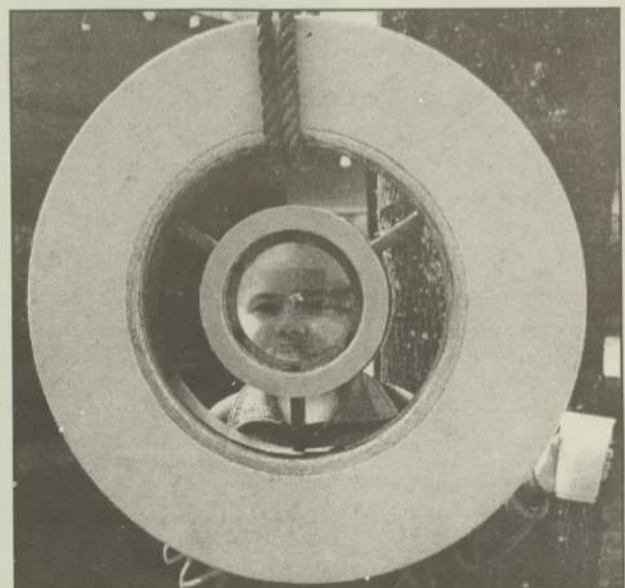
