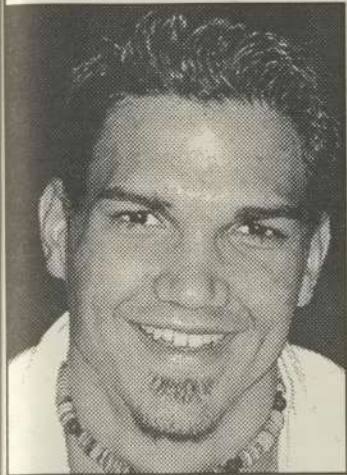

### Presidential Candidates



**Christopher Cox**

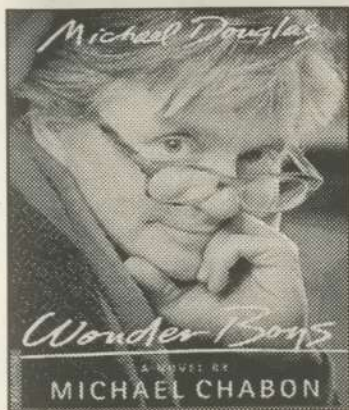
Her hobbies include photography, scrapbooking and skateboarding.

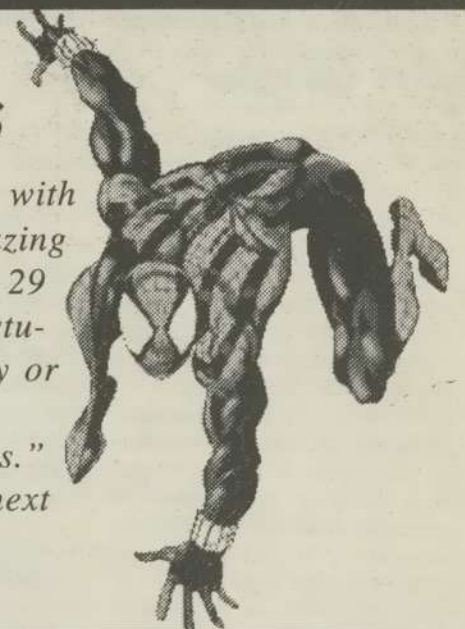
