Author's Night will feature Portland writer Elinor Langer on Wednesday, Nov. 12 in the Gregory

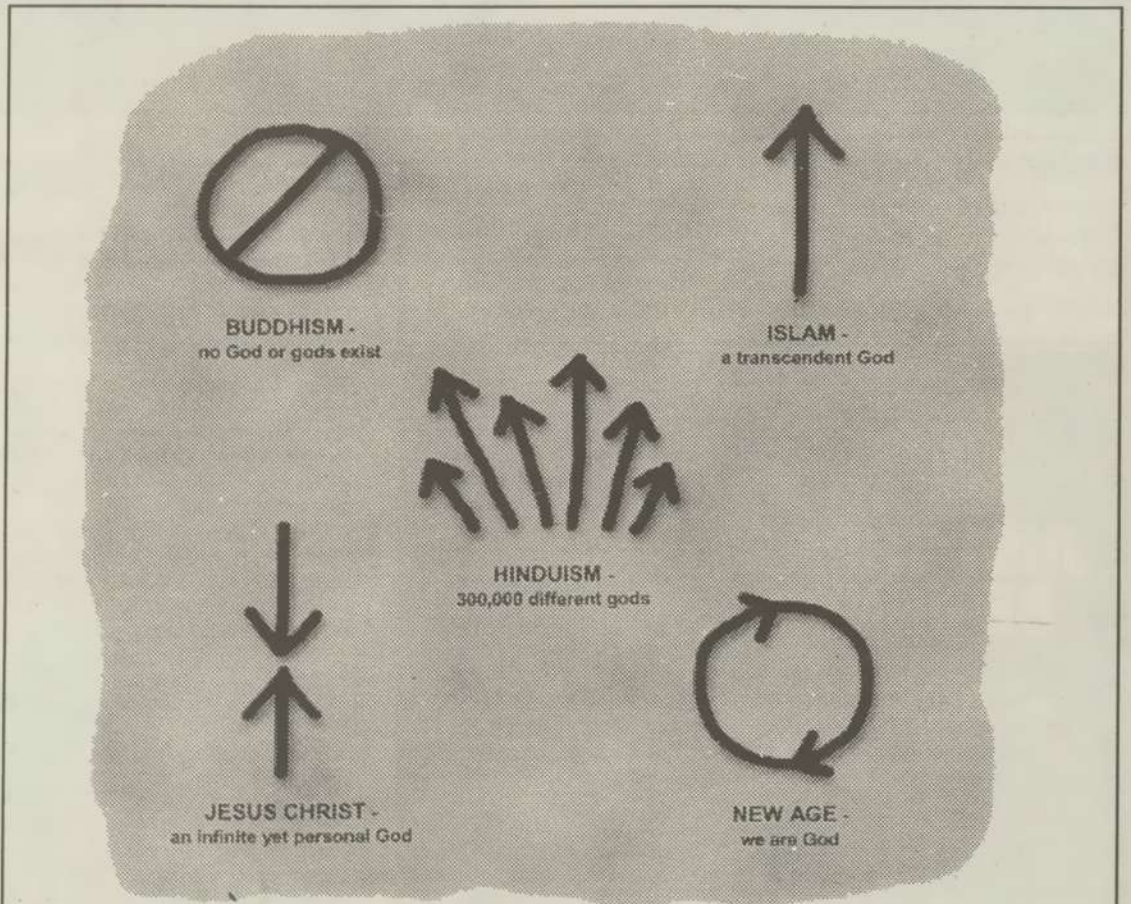
