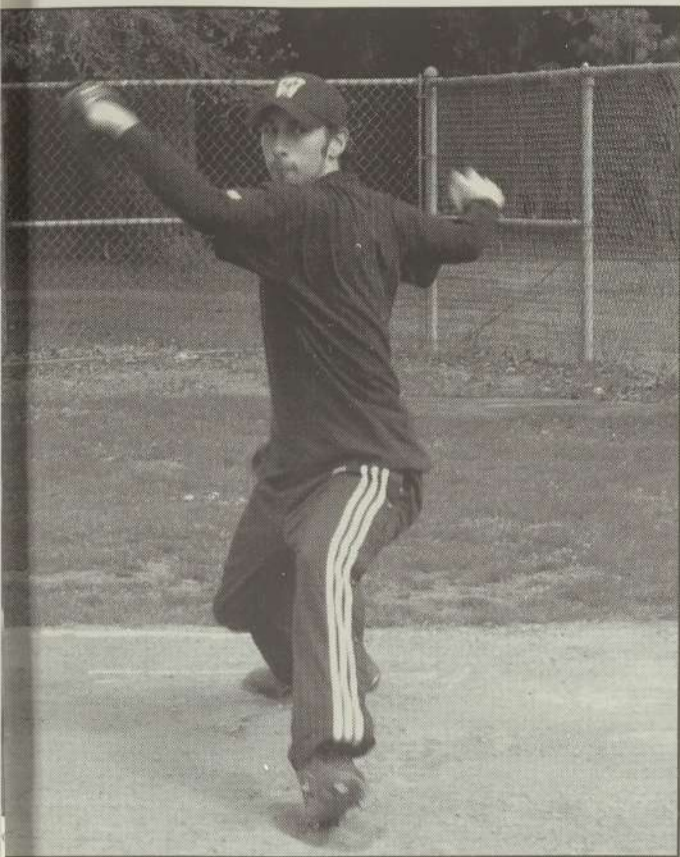


Baseballers still struggle in South

Clackamas baseball (3-5, 5-10) continued their slow start splitting a doubleheader last week with Southwestern Oregon CC (SWOCC).

"We are hitting the ball well," Head Coach Robin Robinson said.

The Clackamas baseballers traveled to Coos Bay last Saturday and were victorious in game one of the doubleheader.

Pitcher Ben Corser started and gave the Cougars five good innings, Robinson said. Hap Purden and Brad Neffendorf came on in relief with Purden getting the win and Neffendorf getting the save.

Catcher Barry Humphrey went 2-3 with one RBI and one run. He also showed his plate presence throwing out three of the four SWOCC base runners attempting to steal. Chris Kosmas went 3-4 with one RBI and one run scored and Ty Combs went 1-3 with a two-RBI double.

The Cougars scored three big runs in the eighth inning after they were down 4-2. Humphrey got the rally started after getting hit by a SWOCC pitch. First baseman Tyler Smith then advanced to first with a base on balls and third baseman Jason Short loaded the bases with a single. Kosmas then smacked an RBI single and Beau

Holstad and Combs were each walked, scoring two runs. The Cougars went on to win game one 6-5.

With a stellar offensive effort as a team the Cougars had 10 hits off of six SWOCC pitchers.

The Cougars lost game two 3-2, giving up nine hits. Bryan Goff worked three innings and took the loss for the Cougars.

The Cougars played their second home doubleheader of the season on April 6 against Chemeketa CC, losing game one 9-5.

In game one, Short went 3-4 with two runs and two RBIs. Noah Breslaw and Jack Whipple both went 1-1 in the loss.

Neffendorf, Purden and Cory Buker all pitched in the loss.

"We gave up too many hits," Robinson said.

In game two, the Cougars' offense put up eight hits but came out on the short end in a 2-1 loss.

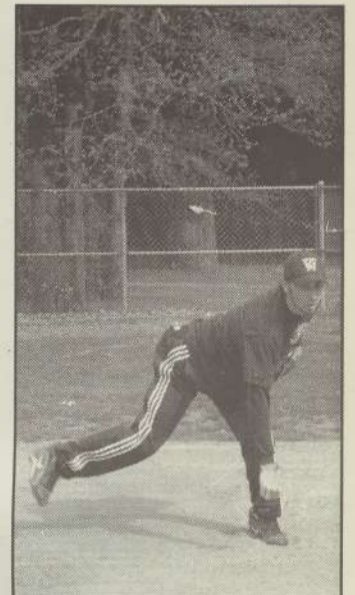
Jordan Denny pitched a great game which should have been good enough to win, Robinson said. Denny pitched a complete game giving up only three hits. He also struck out six Chemeketa batters and walked only two.

Humphrey went 2-4 at the plate, scoring the only Cougar run with a solo home run.

The Cougars also dropped two games on April 3 against Mt. Hood CC by scores of 10-7 and 6-

2. April 1, the Cougars were able to sweep SWOCC by scores of 4-1 and 4-3.

Tuesday, the Cougars squared off with Lane CC in Eugene but results were not available at press time. Saturday, the Cougars will travel to Salem to once again battle Chemeketa.

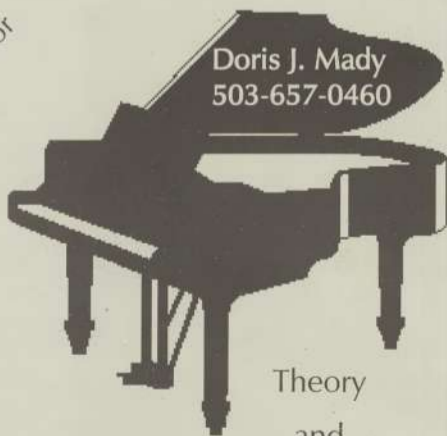
