T-shirt, dirty blue jeans, white tennis shoes and had acne on her cheeks and forehead.

"When [the sketch] was done I said, 'That looks exactly like her!' I was amazed," said Pedersen. "I didn't think it could get that close to what she actually looked like."

Although he admits the adrenaline rush was a little scary, Pedersen claims he was only doing his job.

"We're basically just an extra

set of eyes and ears on campus. We just report any suspicious activities to the officer on duty."

As a criminal justice major, Pedersen was able to enter the cadet program after a background check and several hours of training. The Cadets, hired from within the criminal justice program, provide support for Campus Safety, while gaining on-the-

job training. Pedersen was one of the first cadets to enter the

program about three months ago.

The cadets have been receiving positive feedback from the student body on the new program.

"We've had a lot of comments about how people feel safer with the extra cadets on duty," Pedersen said.

"We're here on campus and we don't screw around," he added. "If we see a problem, we're going to approach it to the best of our ability."

Campus Safety has already approached one person who fit the description of the female, but the case is still under investigation.

Berney shares this grateful feeling of being nominated.

"In high school I wasn't a really great student," she said. "I never would have guessed that I would have been so blessed to be at this point. It's pretty incredible to have anyone nominate you."

Students only receive the scholarship money if they attend one of the Oregon schools participating with the award. Schiely and Berney are both unsure of which college they would like to attend.

Schiely plans to study health sciences and go into nursing, while Berney would like to go into a field involving language, such as international studies or an intercultural studies missions program.

The awards ceremony itself was quite an honor for the scholars. The ceremony began at the Capitol, where they got to meet Gov. Kulongoski.

"We got our awards, shook [the

governor's] hand and got our pictures taken, so that was really cool. He was really nice," said Schiely.

After meeting with the governor, the students went to a luncheon at The Grand Ballroom, with their college president and their families and were introduced to the other students.

During the luncheon, a few Student Scholar Award winners spoke about their time in community college. Students speaking ranged from those who had nearly failed high school—but worked hard to become straight "A" students in college—to those who had overcome difficult language barriers to achieve honor roll status.

"The ceremony was really cool. There were a whole bunch of students there that made me feel like I didn't deserve to be there," said Berney. "They were just incredible people, who maybe have a couple kids while trying to go to college. It was a very humbling experience."
