"Be willing to work," said Gutierrez. "Forget about having a home life or any time for yourself. Say 'Okay, I'll go. Where and when do you want me?' If you're with your girlfriend—kiss her goodbye."

According to Gutierrez, a great photograph most often relies on being at the right place at the right time.

"A photographer was on an assignment to photograph the

president, and he heard a noise, and he looked and saw Reagan going down. He got the picture of Reagan being shot," said Gutierrez. "[Of course,] the photographer received the Pulitzer prize that year, because he was at the right place at the right time, and he was ready."

Gutierrez, who has now retired from UPI, continues to teach photojournalism during fall and spring terms at Clackamas, critiquing students' work and sharing personal experiences during the

Tuesday evening class, as well as teach two photography courses at Clark College and holding a part-time position at Citizen's Photos.

"The only reason that I teach is because I feel I have something to pass on," he said. "I like to let them know what happens when you go on an assignment, how to feel about it and how to go about it," said Gutierrez. "If I could get just one student in the class to pick this up, then I've accomplished something for that term."

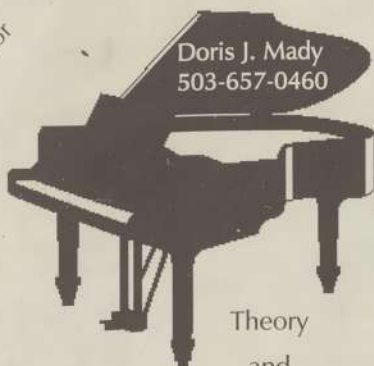
