put a hold on Geoff's mountain climbing excursions the time being.
is a member of the High Altitude Club, a national club of mountain climbers whose goal is to climb the highest peak in every state. Geoff has met his goal in 49 of the 50 states, but has yet to conquer Oregon's highest peak, Hood.
He's tried to climb Mt. Hood four different times [but other conditions prevailed]," said. "Last year there was the accident when four people

went into the crevasse, so they weren't able to go. He's scheduled to [climb Hawaii's highpoint] in June, but I bet that's going to be postponed."
Along with Oregon and Hawaii, Geoff has yet to climb the highpoints of Alaska, Montana and Wyoming.
"You're looking at a guy who sets a goal, puts out a plan and then does it—and that's what this is about," Jan said.
Jan visits her brother in the hospital a couple of times a day and said he is keeping his spirits high.
"He's been very upbeat.

From the moment the rescue happened, he's had an attitude that's been extremely positive," she said.
"He's making an absolute fabulous recovery. He's very strong and athletic; he's in great shape and it's all paying off."
Geoff is expected to be released from the hospital by Friday and will stay with his sister until he is well enough to travel home to Ventura, California.
In a press conference with KGW Northwest News from his hospital bed he said, "I'm not going to get beat by this mountain."
