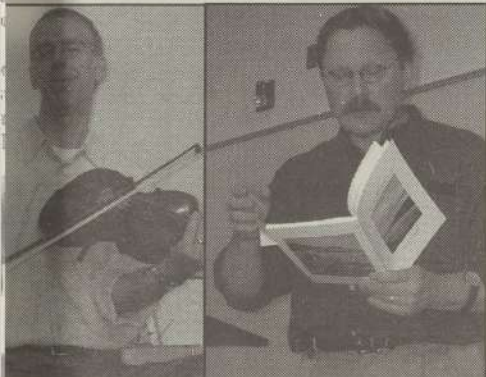


Cultural events on campus and in the community:

Artistic collaboration
 makes poetic music

English instructors James Grabill and David Mount met in Rook Hall's Literary Arts Center last year, in what started out as an experiment six years ago. It has developed into an artistic celebration that blends music and poetry. "I try and music, so often you picture ... piano, berets, go drums—coffee house—poetry—jazz. So we're thinking, what other kinds of music would go well with poetry that would avoid the [clichés]?" said Mount, who played four stringed instruments including banjo, fiddle and a new renaissance instrument made especially for him called a Viola da Zagamba. "I was curious of [the effects of] say, Appalachian and Surrealism," said Grabill, who read selected poetry authored. Grabill became interested in poetry in college. "I never knew language could work that way," he said. Mount and Grabill chose a variety of combinations to play. Some listened with eyes closed, immersed in the sounds filling the room, while others tapped their feet to the rhythm of the varying meters. The passion and Mount displayed for their craft rubbed off on the audience, who showed their appreciation for the duo with enthusiastic applause.
