• Clackamas wrestlers held a dual meet at home Friday night and hosted their own open tournament Saturday in spite of weather conditions.

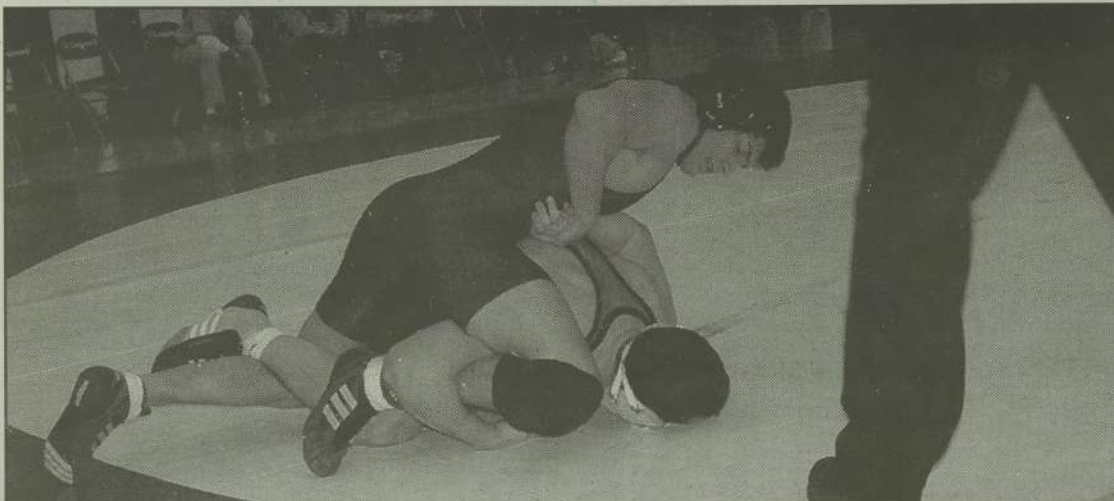

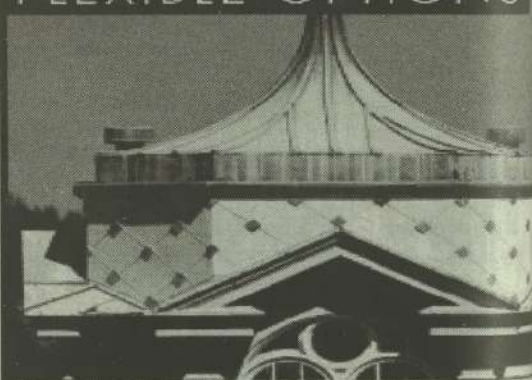
