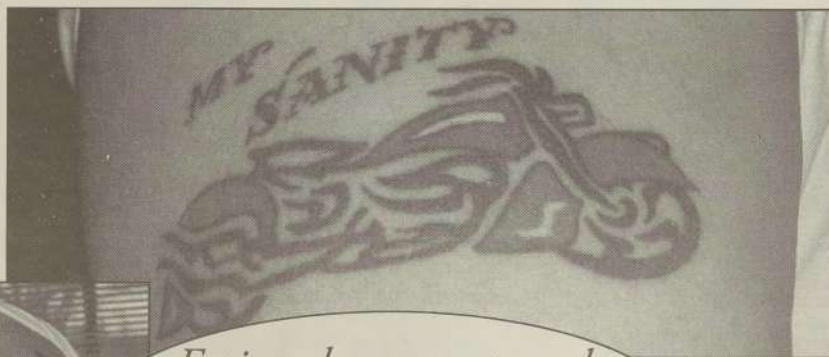
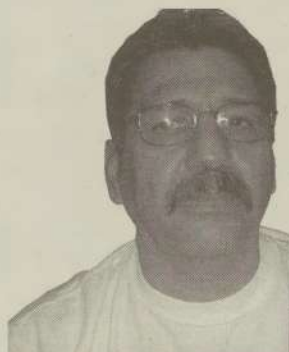
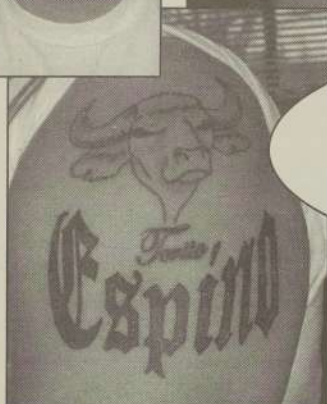


Students, staff express themselves through body modification



Espino chose a motorcycle tattoo because he felt that it meant "relaxing freedom."



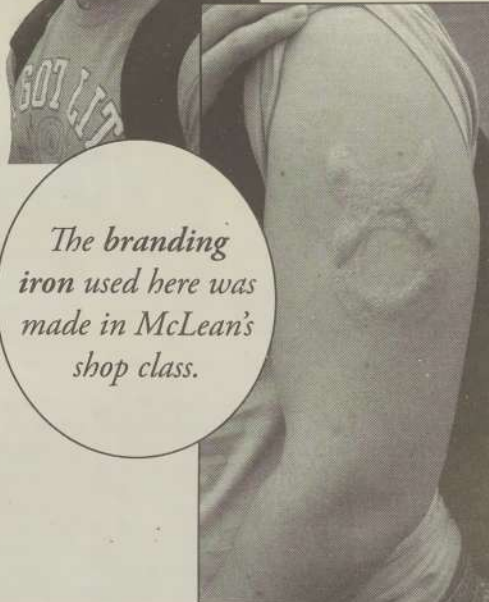
