Sustainability fair.

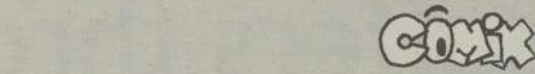

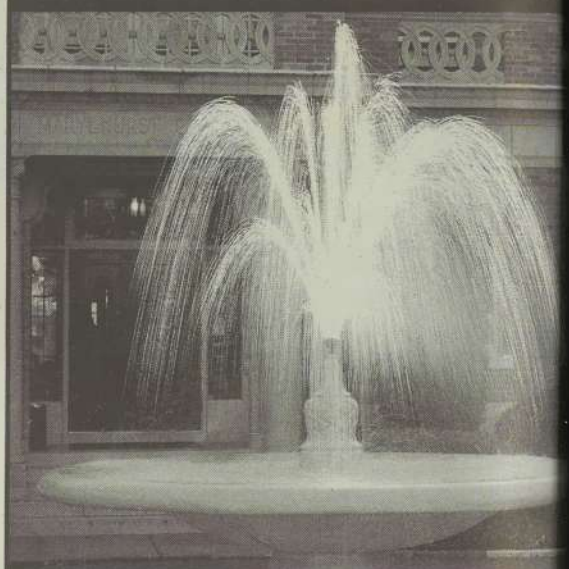
