With most of the fall sports in full swing Clackamas soccer and volleyball is once again leading the way in the NWAACC south.

Volleyball: Sept. 23-defeated Southwestern Oregon CC (30-28, 30-17, 30-21).

The Cougar lady volleyballers are once again off to an excellent start in the NWAACC south. Ranked No. 1 in the coaches' poll (19-2 overall, 2-0 league) with Mt. Hood CC and Walla-Walla ranked second and third respectively.

Soccer: Sept. 23-lost to Shoreline CC 1-2, the Cougars also ranked No. 1 in the coaches' poll (7-2 overall, 7-1 league) with one of their losses coming to Warner Pacific, an NAIA school.

In-Service: Johnson

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"We lack responsibility from our information management system," Johnson said. "We need to make the Datatel system work. We're going to fix it, and it's going to cost a fortune-\$500,000," said Johnson.

Johnson characterized the financial outlook of the college as grim, noting the possibility of a \$975,000 operating deficit.

"If it is a problem, then we're going to address it," said Johnson.

As president of community college presidents, Johnson said he has the responsibility to work with government officials in the state legislature to appropriate more funds for community colleges.

"We're counting on a 10 percent increase in funding from the legislature," said

Johnson.

Johnson also made note of two measures on the ballot in November. Ballot measures 48 and 41 would "devastate" the college, said Johnson. He said Colorado passed similar measures 10 years ago. What followed, according to Johnson, was a decrease in funds for community colleges by more than 20 percent.

"I am not sure what the financial picture is for this institution," Johnson said.

The content of his speech was met with mixed reactions from the staff.

"It's a difficult time; I'm not sure there's anything that could have been said to ease the hearts of the Clackamas family," said Robby Robinson, head baseball coach and instructor. "At this time, there are still many questions and concerns that need to be dealt with."
