The new search engine Goodsearch.com was created last year and designed to generate funds for thousands of charitable organizations and schools.

By donating 50 percent of advertising revenues to charities (approximately one cent per search), Goodsearch.com has provided a charitable option to all the Googles, Yahoos and Alta Vistas that already plague the Internet.

According to the Internet Advertising Bureau search engine, advertising is expect-

ed to accrue six billion dollars in 2006. Goodsearch.com expects to take a portion of this industry and put it to good use.

As well as the more than 15,000 listed organizations, users can add new schools, nonprofit organizations, or parts of the military.

This guarantees any searcher that the money generated by the site is going where it should be.

Any search made without a designated organization goes towards the Web site, so be sure to select a favorite charity or alma mater.

The site was created by Ken and J.J. Ramberg. Ken Ramberg was involved in cre-

ating the Web site Jobtrak.com, which is now Monstertrak.com. J.J. Ramberg was a television reporter and director of marketing at Cooking.com.

Both Rambergs are currently involved with many public service and charitable organizations.

The New York Times, the Oprah Winfrey Magazine, the Wall Street Journal and ABC News have all reported about this fast-expanding site.

"In some cases, policies could not be found. Over-arching financial policies, reports and control need attention to ensure financial and fiduciary rigor," said Wakefield.

Wakefield also acknowledged that Clackamas had already recognized its need for financial upgrades in its self-study.

The second stage of Clackamas' accreditation process is now over (the self-study over the last three years being the first stage), and the college is now

in the third stage.

The third stage started immediately after the accreditation team left the campus.

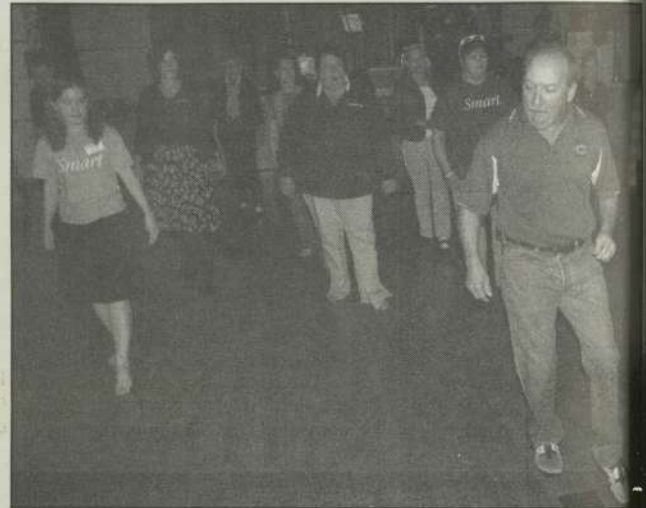
The team will mail a draft of their report to the college so that he or she might correct any factual errors. After the final report, Clackamas' administrators are allowed to attach a written response.

The fourth stage is the confidential recommendation regarding the accreditation of the college to the Northwest Commission on Colleges.

"In January, I will attend the meeting and report about the visit to Clackamas," said Wakefield.

ASG is siphoning student blood for a good cause.

They have coordinated with the American Red Cross to put together this term's blood drive. The blood drive will take place next Wednesday in the Gregory Forum, from 10:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. Students can sign up until 2:30 p.m. that day, through the ASG office.

"We coordinate with the Red Cross," said ASG President Tim Lussier. "We set everything up, get the word out to students ... we do about everything except draw the blood."

Donors must be 16 years old and weigh at least 110 pounds.

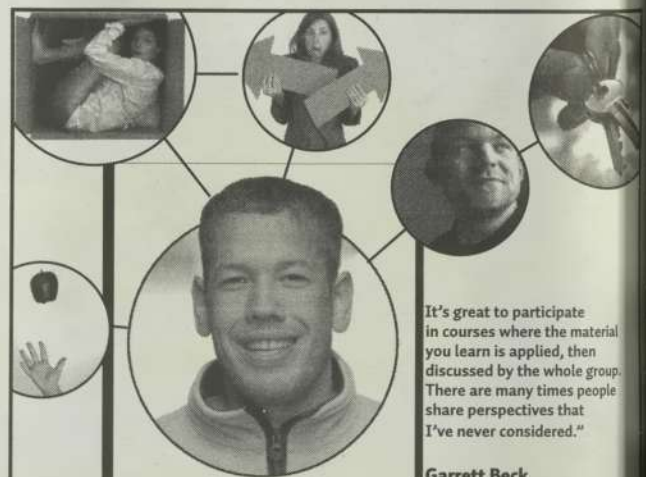
The Red Cross says that before donating, students should have had

a good night's sleep and breakfast or lunch. They should also drink extra water and fluids, and avoid fatty foods such as fries, hamburgers, or ice cream.

At the blood drive, donors will go through four different steps. They will register (if they haven't already though ASG), have a healthy history and mini-physical, donate blood, and then relax and have some refreshments.

"It's important," said Lussier, about donating blood. "People seem to have fun, and you can save lives."
