POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT

TITLE: Associate Judge-Siletz Gaming Court
CLASSIFICATION: Contractual Employee, On-Call
DIVISION: Siletz Tribal Court
COMPENSATION: Negotiable
SUPERVISOR: Chief Judge, Siletz Tribal Court
TERM OF EMPLOYMENT: May be certified as an Associate Tribal Judge by Tribal Council for a period of not less than two years. Associate Judges may be re-appointed at the discretion of Tribal Council.

JURISDICTION OF THE SILETZ GAMING COURT: The Siletz Gaming Court shall have jurisdiction over claims by patrons of Chinook Winds Casino involving non-payment of prizes from gaming activities. The jurisdiction of the Siletz Gaming Court shall be limited to those cases in which the General Manager of the casino has rendered a final decision, and the patron is dissatisfied with that decision.

QUALIFICATIONS: Associate Judges of the Siletz Gaming Court must be a graduate of an accredited law school. Associate Judges must be of good moral character, never have been convicted of a felony, and be in good standing in any legal organization which they are a member or are required to be a member. Associate Judges shall be subject to such other qualifications as may be established from time to time by resolution of the Tribal Council, including but not limited to passage of a written examination testing knowledge of Tribal law; federal Indian law, and other relevant subjects as appropriate. Associate Judges shall be subject to mandatory continuing legal education requirements as may be established by the Tribal Council.

SCOPE OF WORK: Associate Judges shall preside in specific cases as assigned by the Chief Judge, in which case the Associate Judge shall exercise full judicial authority of the Siletz Gaming Court in such proceeding.

TITLE: Associate Judge-Siletz District Court
DIVISION: Siletz Tribal Court
COMPENSATION: Negotiable
SUPERVISOR: Chief Judge, Siletz Tribal Court
TERM OF EMPLOYMENT: May be certified as an Associate Tribal Judge by Tribal Council for a period of not less than two years. Associate Judges may be re-appointed at the discretion of Tribal Council.

JURISDICTION OF THE SILETZ DISTRICT COURT: The Siletz District Court shall have exclusive jurisdiction over the following cases: disputes arising under the Siletz Constitution or under the Civil Indian Rights Act; claims against the Siletz Tribe, Tribal government, Tribal corporations, arms of the Tribe, or against Tribal employees; cases involving monetary claims that exceed \$2,500; appeals from final administrative action of the Siletz Tribe, Tribal government, or arms or entities of the Tribe, pursuant to the Siletz Administrative Procedures Ordinance or other Tribal authority; Indian Child Welfare Act proceedings and other juvenile proceedings; domestic relations cases; and other cases over which the Siletz Tribal Court has subject matter jurisdiction and that are not specifically vested in another branch or division of the Tribal Court.

QUALIFICATIONS: Associate Judges of the Siletz District Court must be a graduate of an accredited law school. Associate Judges must be of good moral character, never have been convicted of a felony, and be in good standing in any legal organization which they are a member or are required to be a member. Associate Judges shall be subject to such other qualifications as may be established from time to time by resolution of the Tribal Council, including but not limited to passage of a written examination testing knowledge of Tribal law, federal Indian law, and other relevant subjects as appropriate. Associate Judges shall be subject to mandatory continuing legal education requirements as may be established by the Tribal Council.

SCOPE OF WORK: Associate Judges shall preside in specific cases as assigned by the

Chief Judge, in which case the Associate Judge shall exercise full judicial authority of the Siletz District Court in such proceeding.
