Tribal Services Specialist Laurie Brown-Godfrey received the 1999 Race Unity Award from the Baha'is of Springfield at an awards ceremony held on June 5 in Springfield.

Brown-Godfrey was recognized for the diversity of her commitments, which includes being a member of Springfield Together, the city's chapter of Community Alliance of Lane County, and the Citizens Police Planning Task Force.

Brown-Godfrey received her award during the opening ceremony of the third annual Race Unity Celebration.

"Several Baha'i youth were there and it was good to see youth involved in promoting racial unity. We need more Springfield youth involved in the future. We all need to do a lot more work to come together," she said.
