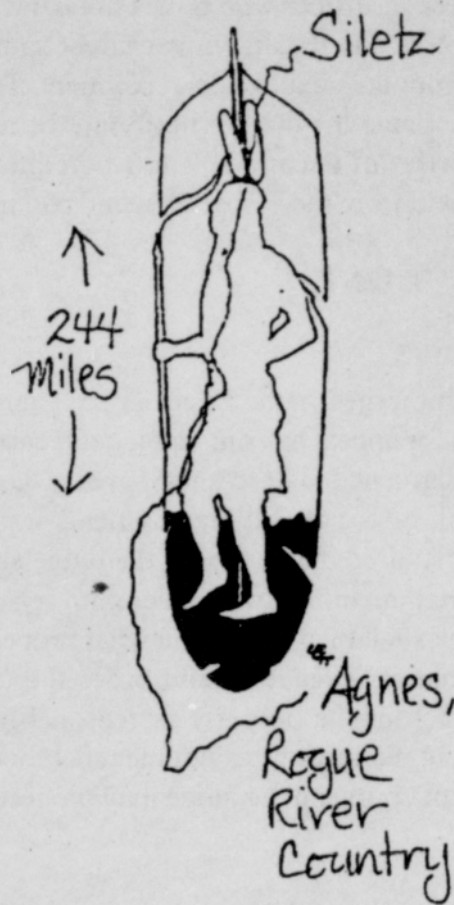

Save Money at Newport Apartments

The Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians has entered into an agreement with the Little Creek Apartments in Newport. A \$50 monthly discount is available on two-bedroom apartments for Tribal members or employees of the Tribe or Chinook Winds Casino.

The apartments are located at 365 NE 36th St., nestled in the trees just two blocks from Highway 101. The complex features lush landscaping with a number of picnic areas, three fenced playgrounds, a walking trail, laundry facilities and on-site management. An expanded free video selection is available.

Two-bedroom and three-bedroom apartments are available. All units have forced-air heat and all appliances, plus a ceiling fan. The three-bedroom units also have a second full bathroom and washer/dryer hookups.

Two-bedroom units rent for \$425/month after the \$50 discount. To obtain information on three-bedroom units or tour the complex, call Judy Jennings, resident manager, at 541-265-2663.

The Run to the Rogue is an annual event that commemorates the removal of Siletz Tribal ancestors from their homeland in the Rogue River country.

In 1851, gold was discovered on the Rogue River. Conflict between the settlers who came for the gold and the native people lead to the Rogue River Indian Wars (1851-1856). By treaty agreement, the tribes agreed to relocate to a reservation on the Central Oregon coast. In November 1855, the 1.1-million-acre coast reservation was designated as the permanent home for all tribes from Western Oregon.

The first group of people were removed near the beginning of February 1856. In the next year, groups were taken to the reservation by either overland marches or transport on steamship decks via the coast and the Columbia River. The most difficult trips were the 244-mile forced marches from Port Orford to the Siletz Agency, marches that included many elders, pregnant mothers, and small children.

Within 20 years, the 1.1-million-acre coast reservation had been reduced by 75 percent of its original size without any treaty agreement or compensation.

The Run to the Rogue helps Siletz Tribal members remember with respect the hardships suffered by their ancestors and renew the physical and spiritual connections. People interested in participating in the Run to the Rogue can pick up applications at the Siletz administration building or the nearest area office.
