Oregon Department of Forestry district offices can help you obtain woodcutting permits on state forests. Permits are issued only through district field offices. Office hours are Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. unless noted. Area codes are 503 unless noted. Most state permits are \$10 for two cords.

Clatsop State Forest: 325-5451; recorded message, 325-7215; 92219 Highway 202, Astoria. Information is updated Monday and Wednesday on the recorded message phone; permits are sold Tuesday and Thursday when available.
