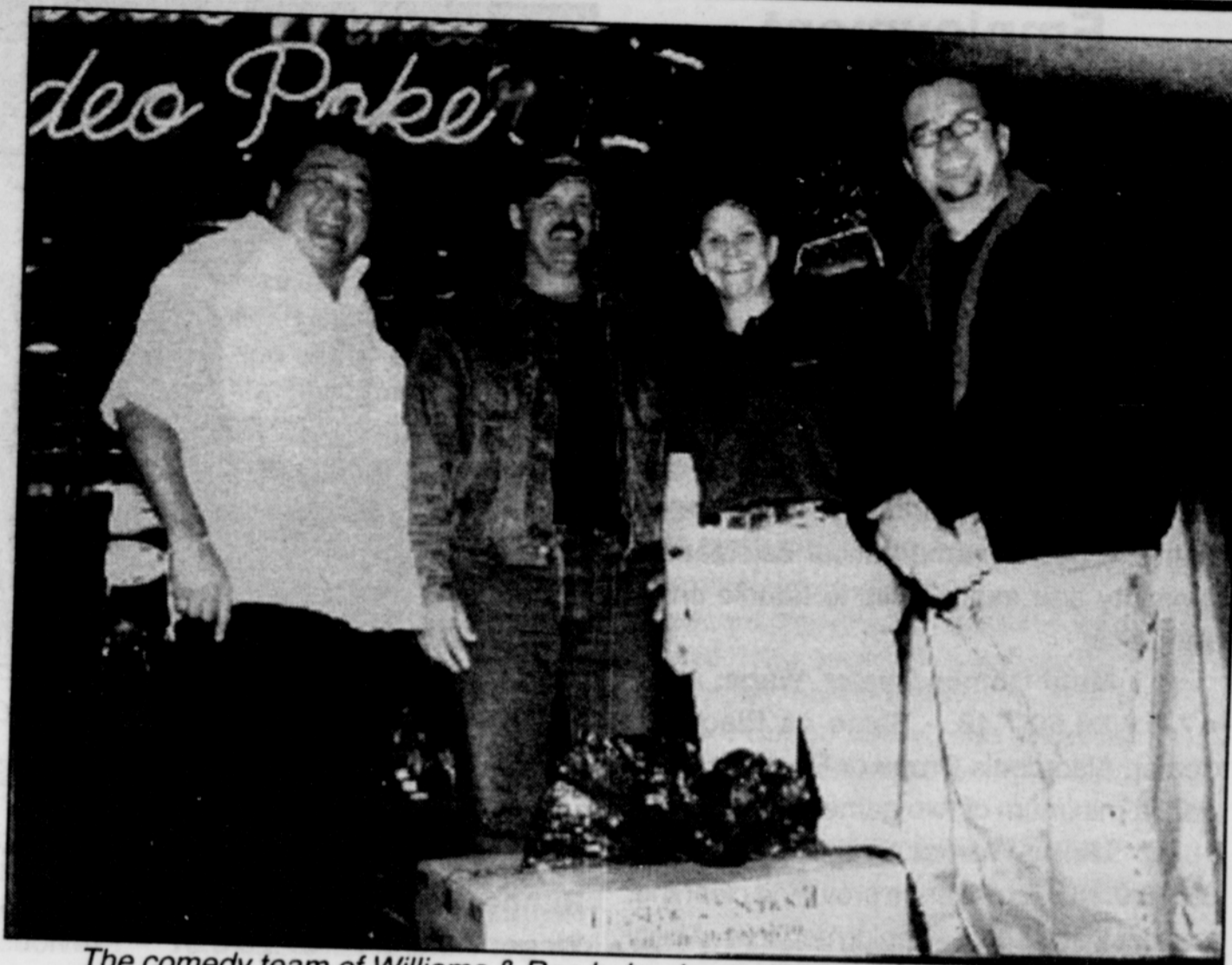

A Senior Fair will be held at Chinook Winds Convention Center on July 11 and 12.
