## Reasons Not to Spank

The use of physical force as a means of discipline can have many negative effects. You shouldn't spank because:

-  Spanking teaches children that they don't have control over their behavior. Lack of inner control can block children's ability to solve problems and make decisions on their own. Spanking can teach children to rely on others for control of their behavior. Then children are more likely to let other events and people influence their actions rather than using their own resources.
-  Spanking teaches children that hitting is acceptable behavior. Children can learn

## Viral Meningitis

There are two types of meningitis (me-nun-ji-tus): bacterial and viral.





Bacterial meningitis is the most serious. Viral meningitis is an infection caused by a virus. The infection affects the covering of the spinal cord (called the meninges) and the brain. It is more common to get viral meningitis in late summer or early fall. It most often affects young children.

Viral meningitis is spread by coughing, sneezing, sharing utensils, and by not washing hands after using the toilet.

Symptoms may include fever, stiff neck, red rash, headache, excessive sleepiness, and sometimes nausea and vomiting. Breastfeeding can help protect a baby from meningitis because of the antibodies passed to the baby from the mother's milk.

Most people who get viral meningitis recover fully, but a doctor should always be seen to diagnose an illness correctly and determine what treatment is needed.
