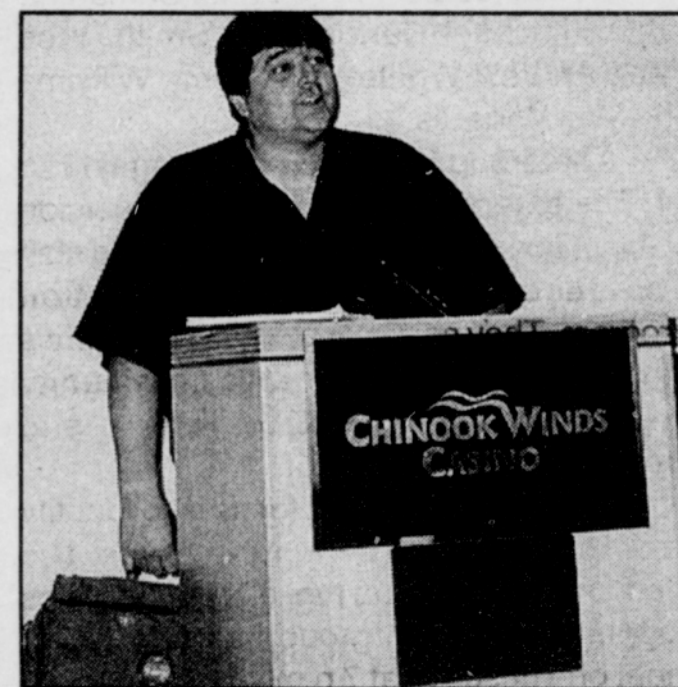
Sharon Butler Scholarship
