## Siletz Tribe Donates to Local Groups

The Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians has distributed \$9,524 to Native American organizations, schools, and non-profit agencies

The Siletz Tribal Charitable Ad Hoc Committee has completed a year of donations generated from the profits of Chinook Winds in 1998. The committee has given away a total of \$134,020.

An advisory board is being established to distribute profits from 1999 and thereafter. It will consist of one Siletz Tribal Council member, three Siletz Tribal members, two non-tribal members from Lincoln County, and one member of the general public from the tribe's service area. Term of office is three years.
