Ed Edmo, a poet, playwright and storyteller from Celilo Falls, leads off the series on April 4.

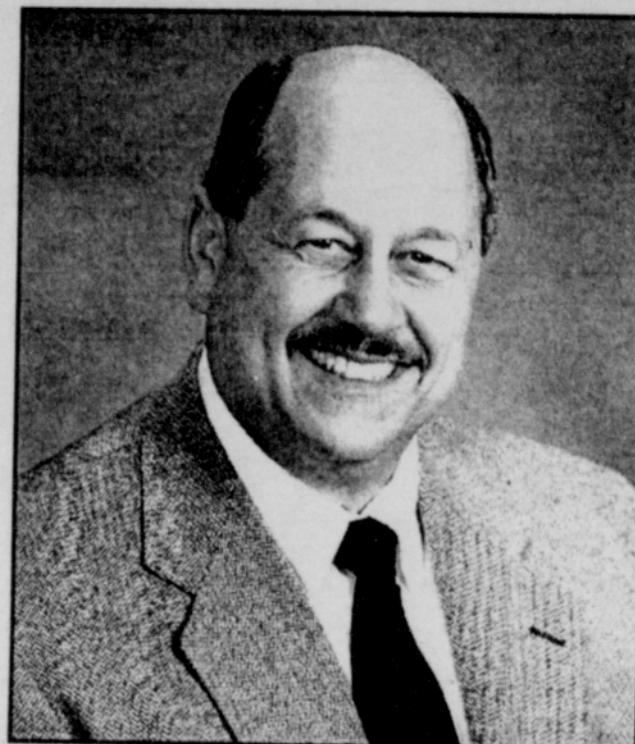

Survivors include brothers Clark Martin of Hillsboro, Ore.; Antonne Martin of Crescent City, Calif.; daughters Ernestina Wooten of Keizer, Ore.; Darlene Williams of Apache Junction, Ariz.; Carlotta Edenfield of El Cajon, Calif.; and a son, Dennis Lane of Salem. She had 14 grandchildren, 22 great-grandchildren, and five great-great-grandchildren.

Services were held on Feb. 24, 2001, at the Siletz Tribal Community Center and interment was at the Paul Washington Cemetery in Siletz.

### Marie Fuller - 1924-2001

Marie Fuller, 76, of Siletz, Ore., died Feb. 21, 2001, in Siletz. She was born in Siletz on March 10, 1924. She was a homemaker for most of her life.

She was a member of the Siletz Assembly of God Church. She was a member of the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians and one of the last two full-blooded Siletz Indians.

Survivors include her daughter, Darlene Smith of Siletz; grandsons Darold Edwards of McMinnville, Ore., and Darrin Smith of Siletz; granddaughters Tina Marie Edwards of Newport, Ore., and Danelle Smith of Siletz; and a great-granddaughter, Josie Edwards of McMinnville.

Services were held on Feb. 23, 2001, at the Siletz Tribal Community Center. Interment followed at the Paul Washington Cemetery in Siletz.
