A memorial service was held on April 30, 2001, at the Siletz Tribal Community Center in Siletz. A potluck dinner was held immediately following the service.

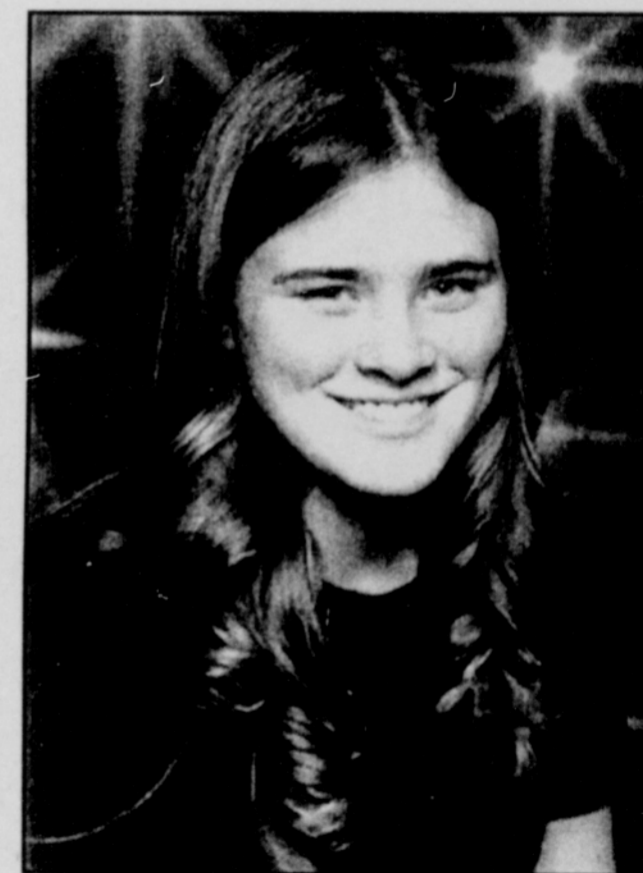
