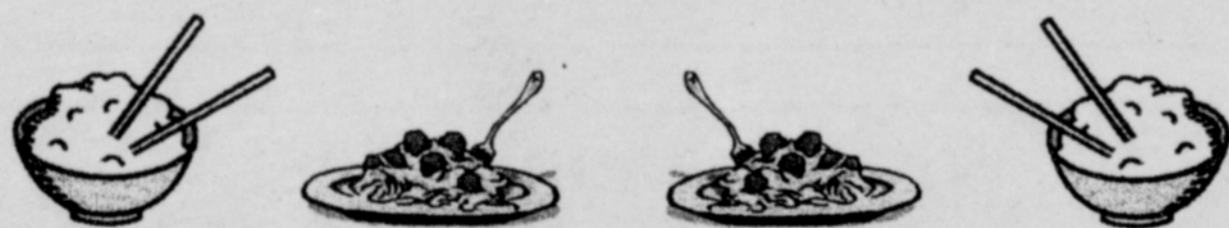
## Employees Contribute to Local Community
