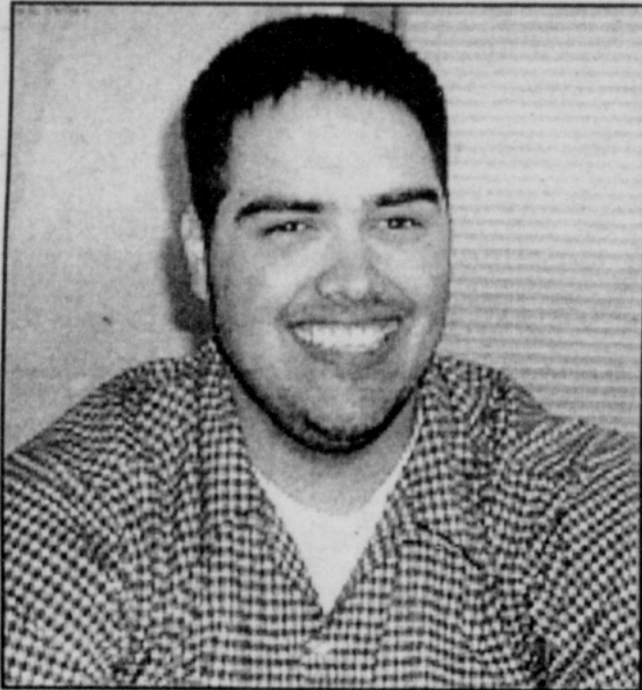


## Tribal Youth Graduate from College, High School

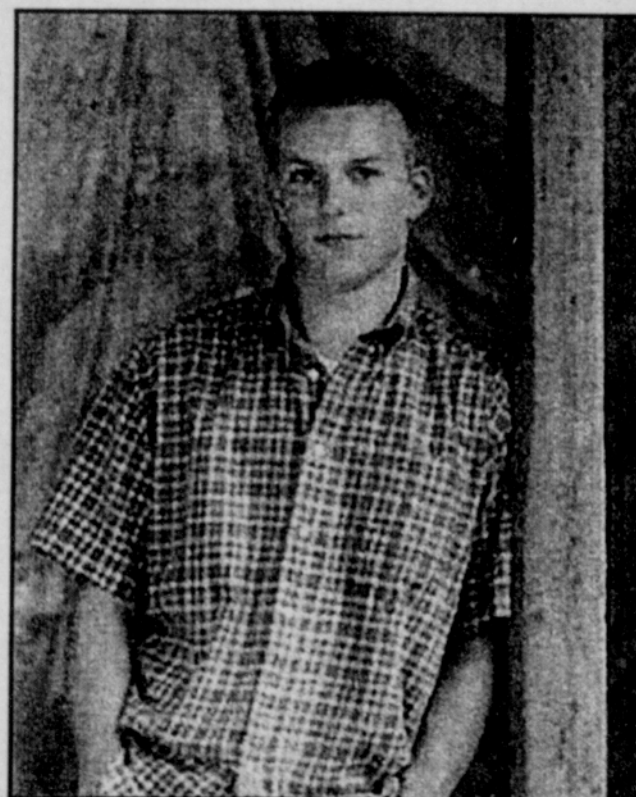
### McClintock Graduates from High School

Ryan McClintock will graduate from Oregon City High School on June 9, 2002, at the Earle A. Chiles Center at the University of Portland.

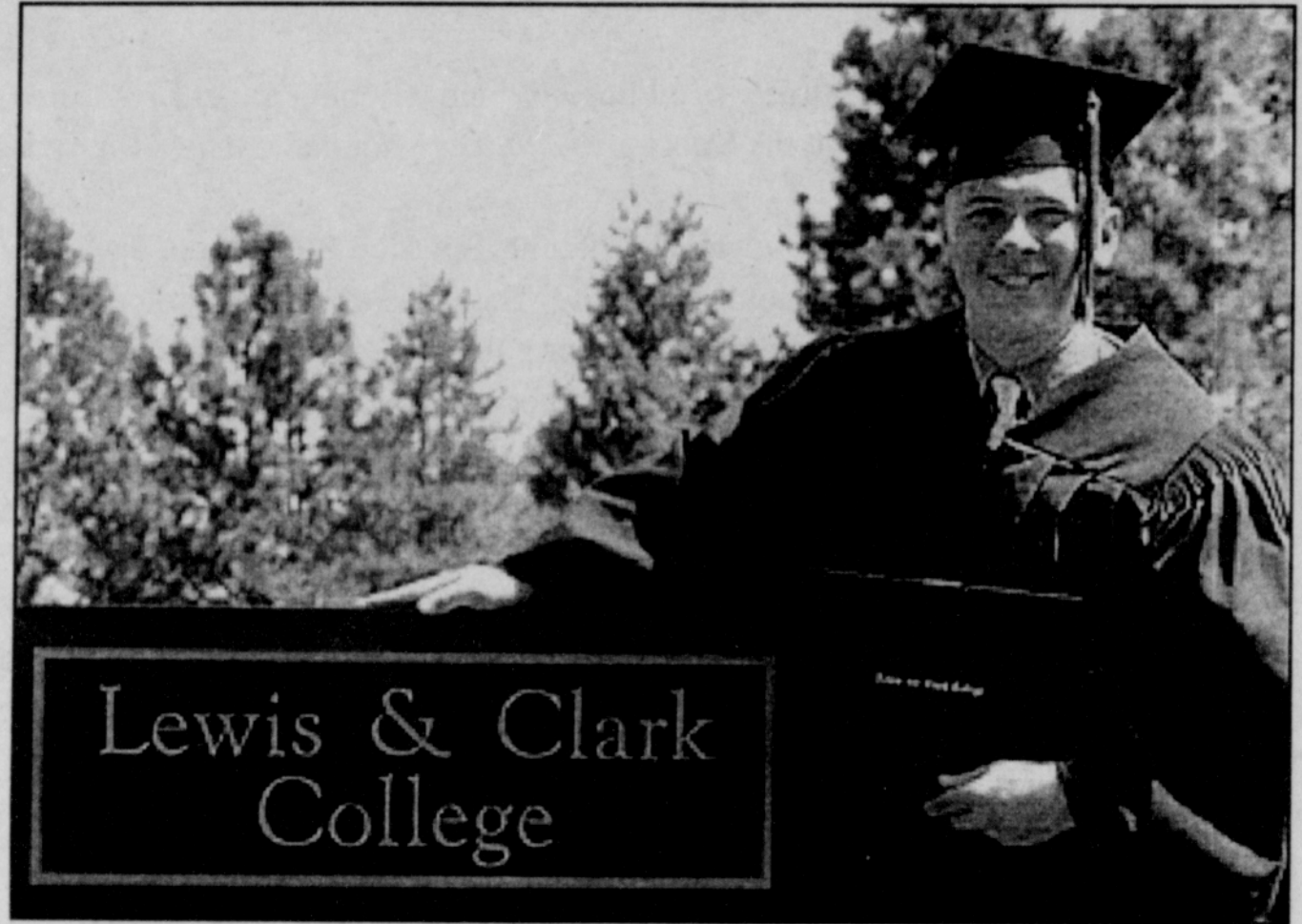

Ryan McClintock

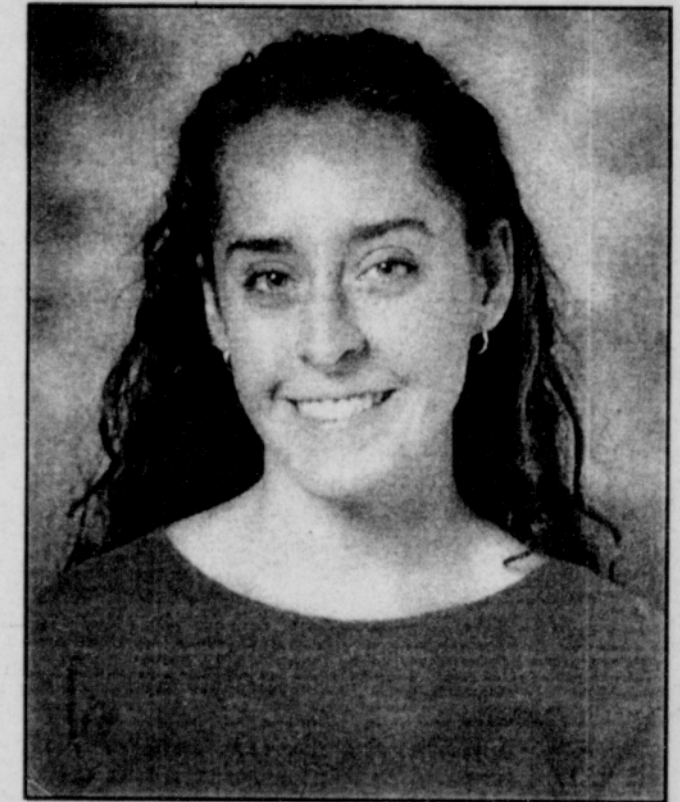


Brent Walker
