### Lanes Receive Second Small Business Grant

Brett and Kelly Lane, owners of Coast Concrete Cutting, received a \$10,000 small business grant from the Siletz Business Development Center in April.

The Lanes completed the ONABEN classes in 1997 and have been in business for five and one-half years. They own the only concrete cutting business in Lincoln County. Coast Concrete Cutting services include flat sawing, core drilling, wall sawing, and concrete sawing, drilling, and removal.

Brett plans to use the grant to replace a concrete flat saw, which he explained as a cleaner burning saw for indoor cutting that has a three-speed gear box for deeper sawing.

"We are very happy," Kelly said. "And we would like to thank Lisa Norton, Gregg Gubuan, and Stephanie Morrow for all their help."
