## Siletz Tribe, Kiwanis, and Chinook Winds Host Candidates Fair

The Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians of Oregon, The Kiwanis Club of Lincoln City, and Chinook Winds Casino are co-hosting a candidates fair in the casino's convention center on Oct. 9, at 6:30 p.m.
