Books are Good for Kids

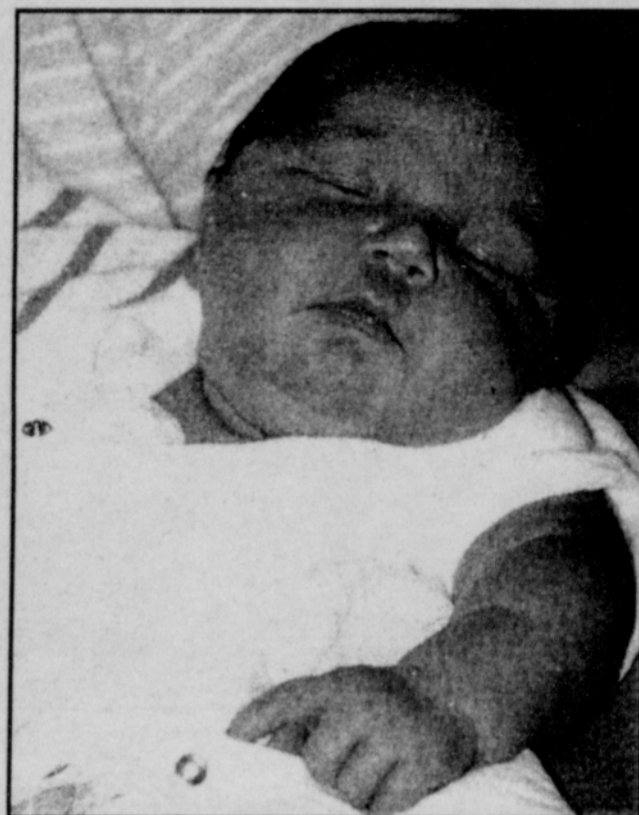
Usborne's science books were awarded third place in the Elementary Science category in the 1999 Practical Home Schooling Reader Awards.

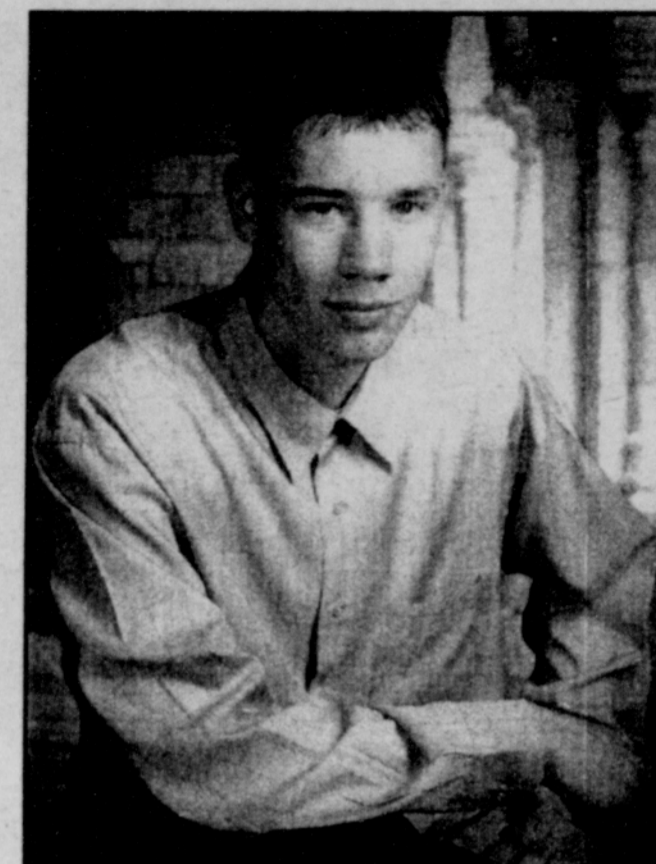

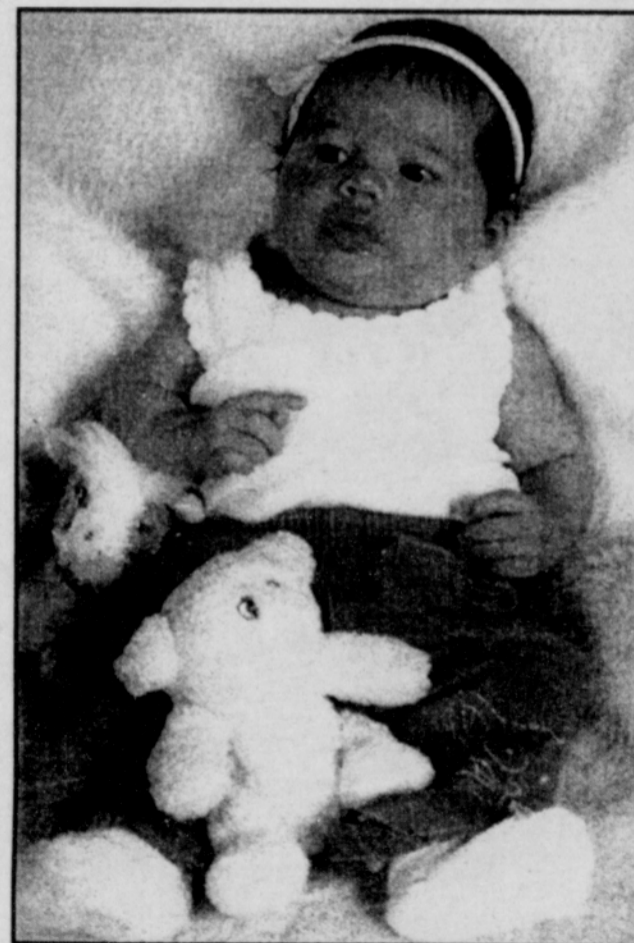
Sorry to have missed our pow-wow.
