## Grothe Named Third Quarter Superstar

Anthony Grothe, a member of the Chinook Winds Soft Count Team, was selected as the casino's Superstar for third quarter of 2002.

Tribal elders, members of the Gaming Board of Directors, the Siletz Tribal Gaming Regulatory Agency, Chinook Winds directors, and several casino staff were present at the superstar ceremony on Oct. 30. In recognition of his achievement, Grothe received a check for \$1,000 and a marble tile that will be displayed at the front of the casino.

To be eligible to receive the Superstar award, an employee must perform his/her duties at a high standard of excellence on a consistent basis. He/she must exhibit above-the-norm internal and external customer service and be a team leader by example.

Instances of exemplary performance must be documented. After a person is nominated for the award, the nomination goes through several reviews before the final selection is made.

Both casino staff and guests can submit Superstar nominations. With more than 700 employees, and only four of these awards given each year, it's a real honor to be chosen as the Superstar.
