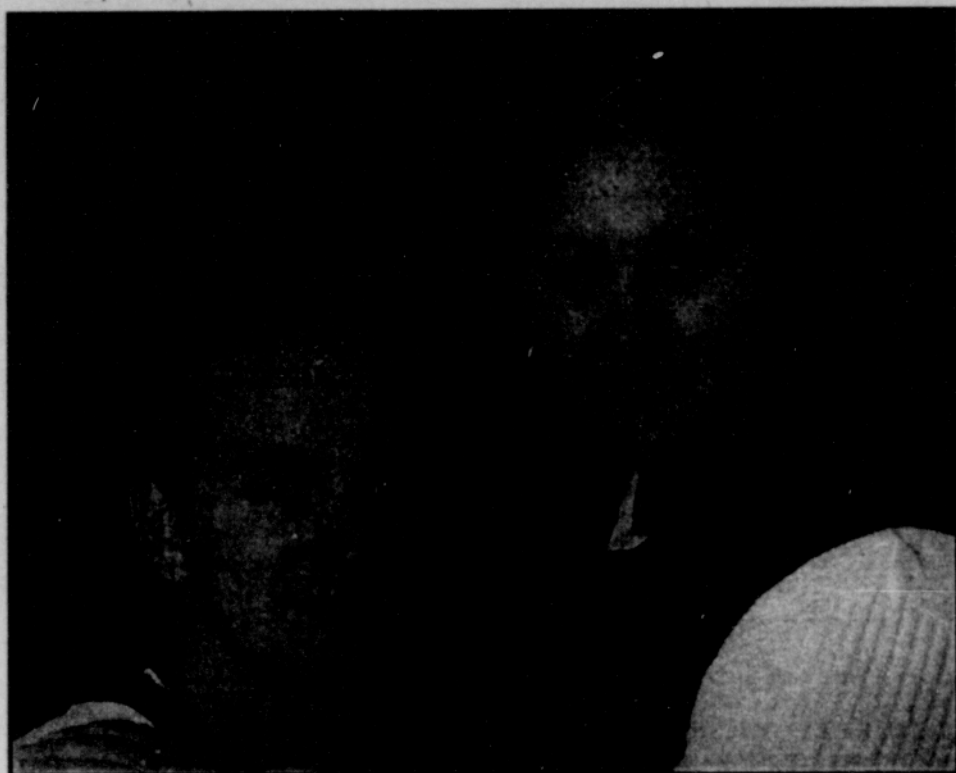


Williams, Goodell Engaged

A memorial service was held on Nov. 8 at the Siletz Tribal Community Center. Interment was at Paul Washington Cemetery in Siletz.

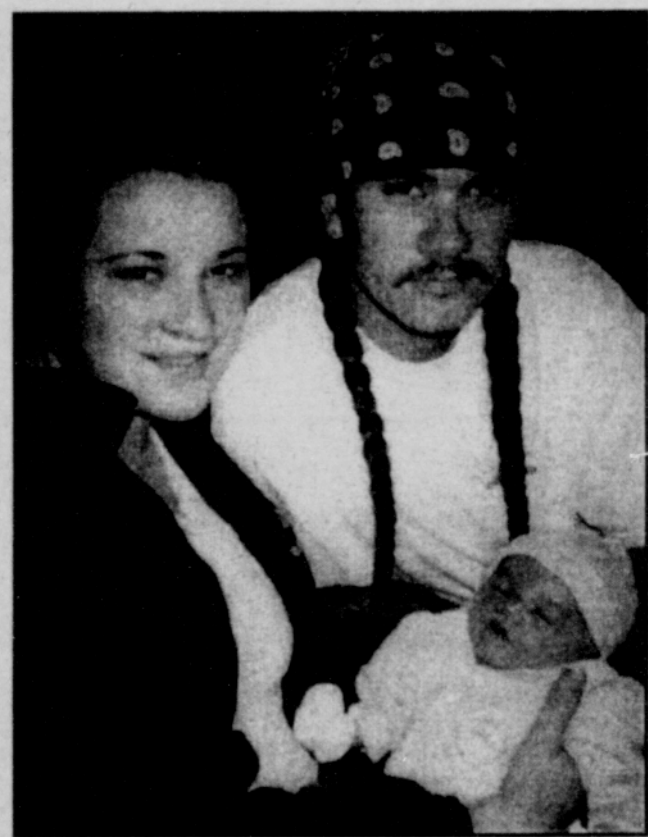
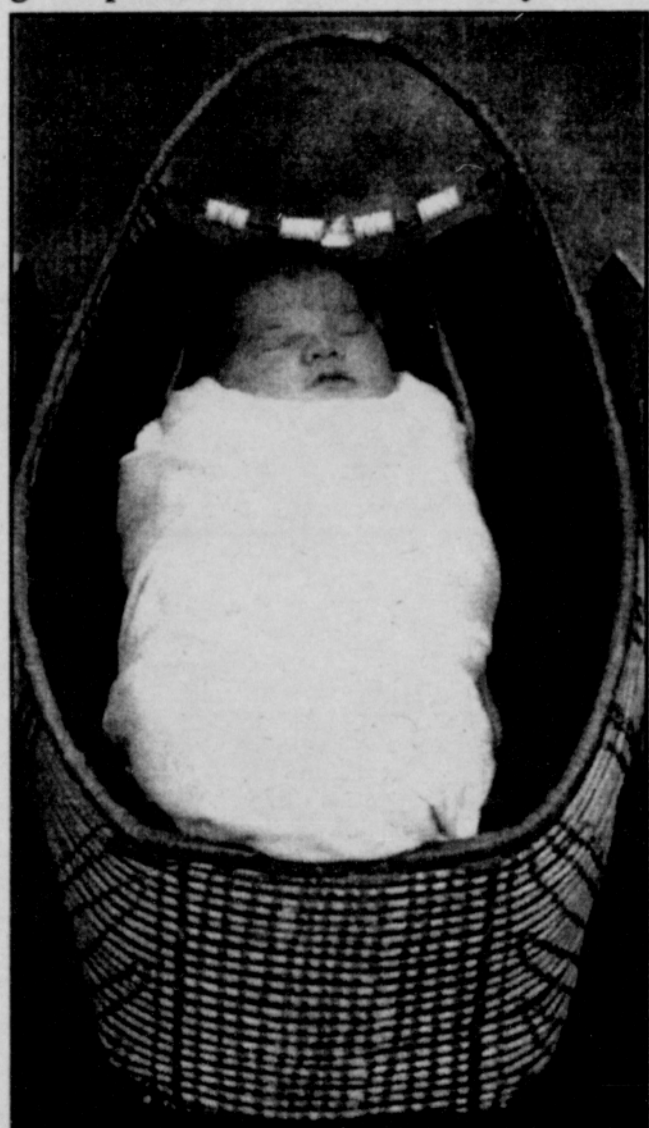
Parents Welcome Cintah
