

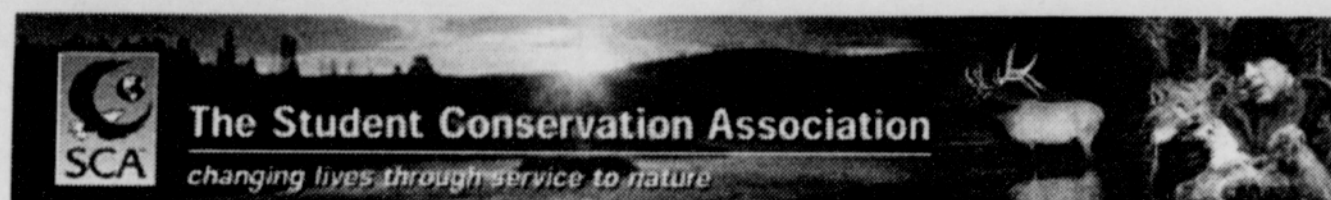

Yellowstone Recruits for 2003 Youth Conservation Corps Program

Yellowstone National Park Superintendent Suzanne Lewis has announced that recruiting for the park's 2003 Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) program has begun.

YCC is a summer employment program for young men and women age 15-18. Through work projects done in the park, YCC provides enrollees with a better understanding of their environment and management of our natural resources.

The 2003 YCC program will run for eight weeks from June 14 through Aug. 11 and participants will be required to live on location. Room and board will be provided at a minimal cost to enrollees. Wages will be set at the federal minimum wage of \$5.15 per hour.



The program will consist of a 30-member camp with enrollees selected nationwide. Participants must be at least 15 years of age by June 14, but must not turn 19 until after August 11. Applications must be postmarked by March 15, 2003. Selections will be made randomly from all qualifying applicants.

Crews will focus their efforts on projects dealing with rehabilitation of trails and backcountry areas, campground restoration, and a wide variety of resource management, maintenance, and research projects. A wide spectrum of environmental education programs will be offered, as well as an extensive recreation program.

DreamCatchers has joined forces with The Northern Navajo Medical Center Health Promotions Program of Shiprock, N.M., to produce a health and fitness two-video set entitled "Rez Robics" and "Rez Robics for Couch Potato Skins."

The project was inspired by the fact that diabetes has become one of the most serious threats to the health of Indian people both on reservations and in urban settings.

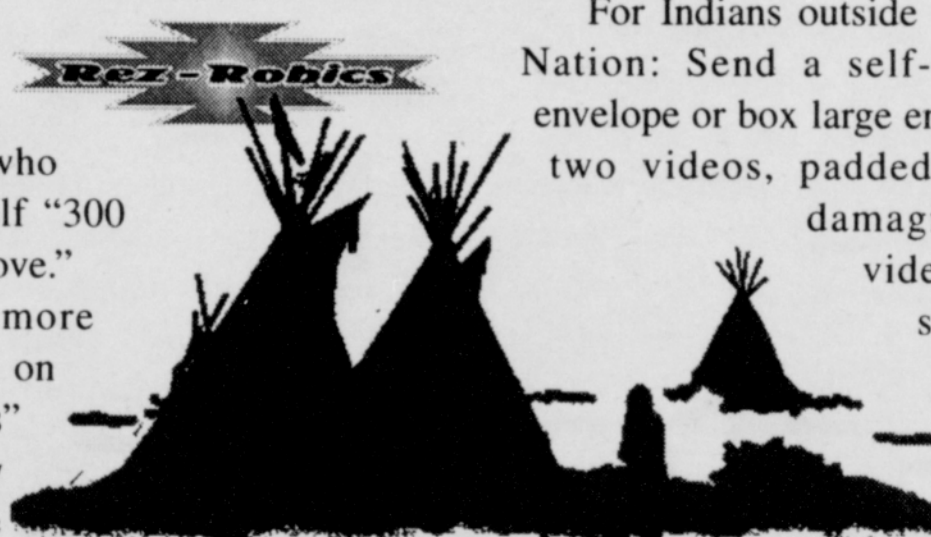
"Rez Robics" is a full-fledged aerobics video mixing pow-wow dancing and martial arts with normal aerobics movements. "Rez Robics for Couch Potato Skins," which in November 2001 won the Best Public Service Announcement Award at the American Indian Film Festival in San Francisco, is a half-hour comedy featuring two prominent Native actor/comedians - Elaine Miles (*Northern Exposure*, *Smoke Signals*) and Drew

LaCapa, the up-and-coming comedian who calls himself "300 pounds of love."

For Indians living on or near the Navajo Nation: Contact Navajo Health Promotions at 505-368-6499.



For Indians outside the Navajo Nation: Send a self-addressed envelope or box large enough to fit two videos, padded to avoid

damaging the videos during shipping. The padded envelope or box

must have enough postage to cover the cost of shipping the videos to you. We recommend \$5 of postage for priority mail using stamps, not metered postage (metered postage won't work when mailed from a different location or on a different date). Send the self-addressed and stamped envelope or box to Dreamcatchers, 23852 PCH #766, Malibu, CA 90265.

For Native organizations with duplication capabilities: If you

represent a Native organization with resources to professionally duplicate and distribute copies of "Rez Robics" free of charge to your community, you can receive betacam sp master copies by sending a request on your organization's letterhead with a money order for \$125 (U.S.). This will include the rights to make as many copies as you wish as long as no money is charged for them. Send to Dreamcatchers, 23852 PCH #766, Malibu, CA 90265.
