Siletz Youth Produce Prevention Video, Other Materials

Combine 21 young people and \$75,000 and what do you get? A tobacco prevention program designed and produced by Siletz Tribal youth.

These young people are developing a video, brochure, poster, and Web site as part of the American Legacy Foundation tobacco education media project.

This is part of Legacy's \$21 million grant program to strengthen existing tobacco prevention and cessation efforts and create new strategies for addressing tobacco-related health

disparities among American Indians and Alaska Natives. The youth and their projects include:

Several youth spent two days in a studio in Portland, Ore., recording a song written by Shane and sung by Shane and Apples. While these two were recording, other youth filmed scenes for the video in a second studio.

Apples stated, "When I was asked to sing, I thought it was a good idea because I sing sometimes at school and at church, but I've never really sang specifically for a good reason such as this project. I thought it would be a good way to get the message across because a lot of people like music."

The youth have received a bit of help from some adults, including DeAnna Pearl, American Legacy Media Project coordinator; Tom Wiecks from The Creative Department in Portland;
