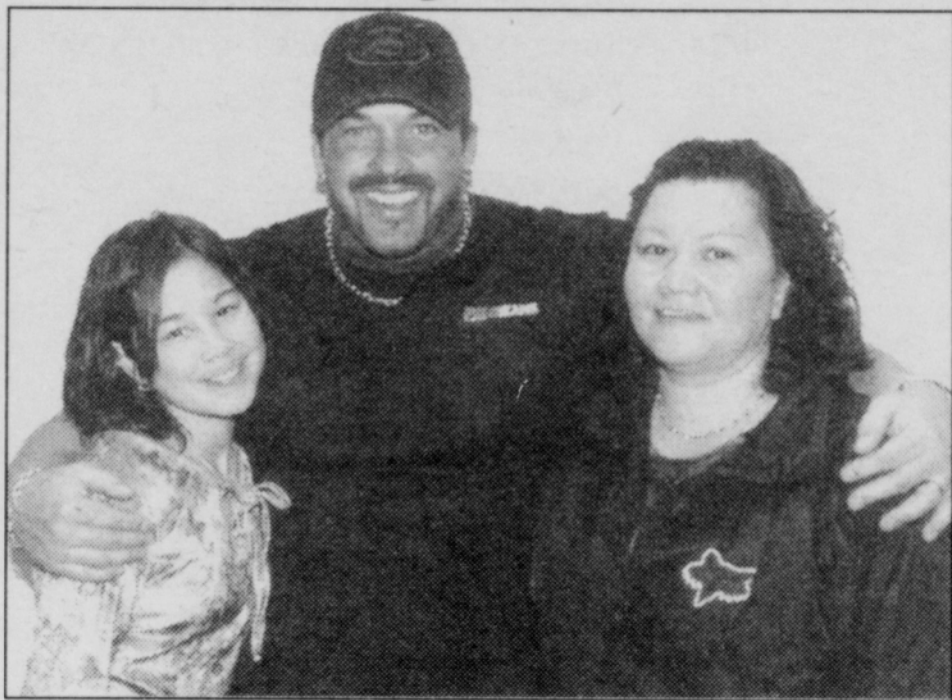


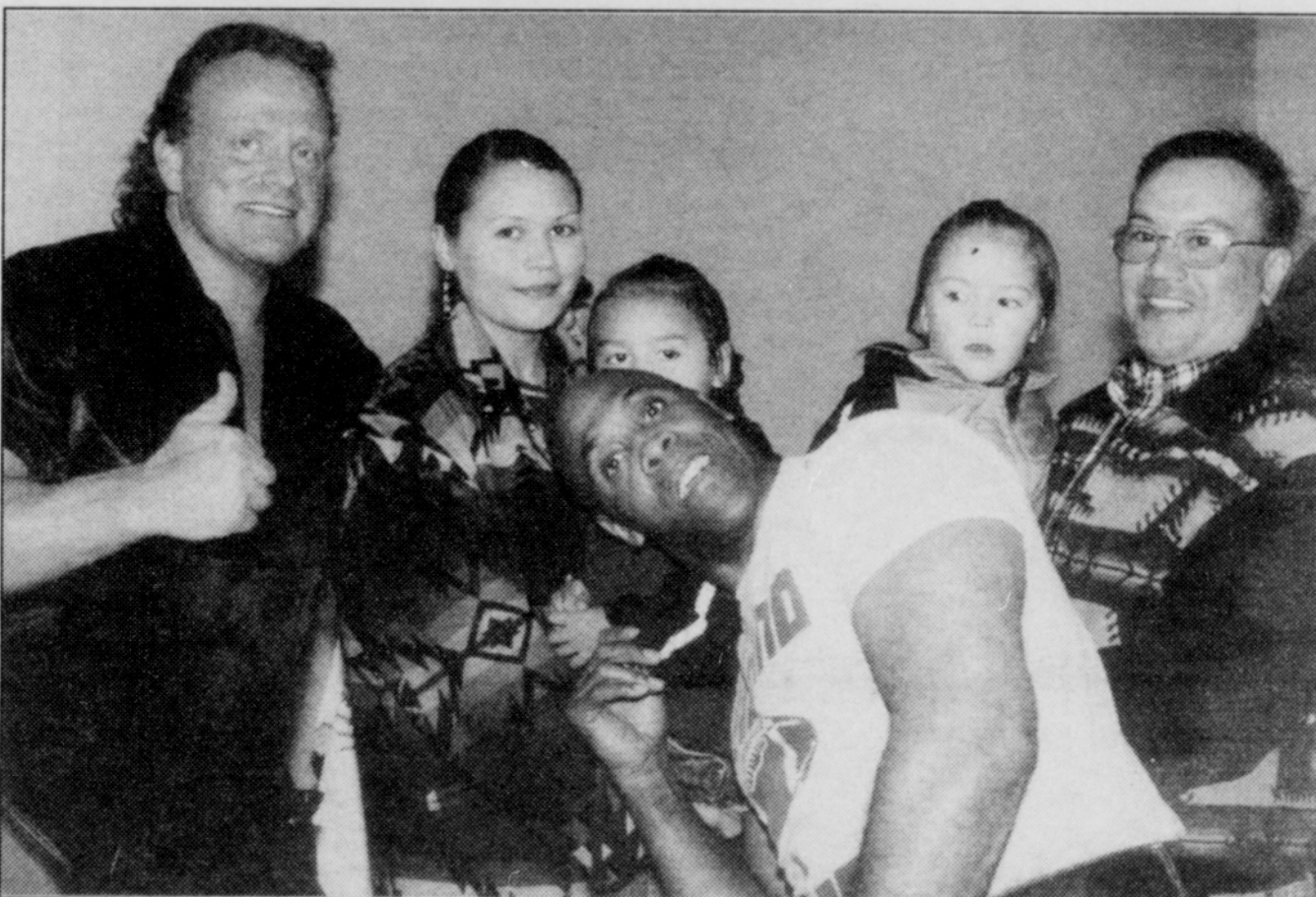

back in 1907. Her father and his brother ran the general store in Siletz in those days. It's especially rewarding to work with a community I'm connected to

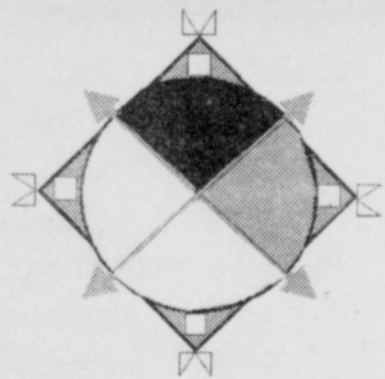
by history, with the hope of improving the future."

Menzie Graduates from McNary HS

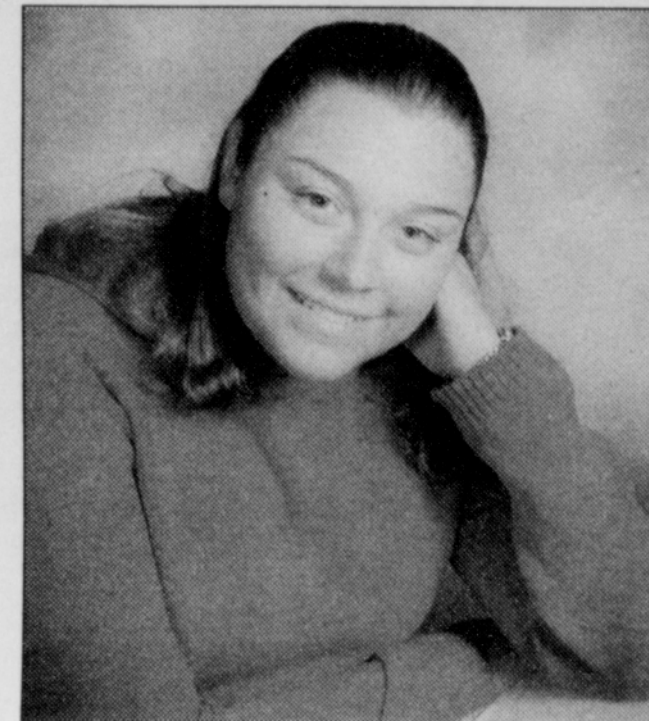
