Our allocation of controlled hunt permits are: Alsea Unit - antlerless deer: 20; Stott Mt. - antlerless deer: 30.

them were symptomatic to allow transmission to other birds."

Recommendations for hunters:

- Don't handle any sick or dead game birds.
- Cook meat to an internal temperature to 180°F.

The Bottom Line

There are a lot of diseases in wild animals (brucellosis, tularemia, plague) that present much more of a human health hazard than CWD or West Nile virus. Use common sense when handling game meat, and you won't expose yourself to any of them.
